	1. TO RECEIVE AND NOTE THE SUBMISSION TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOUNDARY COMMISSION FOR ENGLAND ON THE FUTURE WARDING PATTERN FOR THE DISTRICT.
Recommendations	2. TO INVITE MEMBERS TO MAKE REPRESENTATIONS AND/OR THEIR OWN SUBMISSION DIRECTLY TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOUNDARY COMMISSION, EITHER AS INDIVIDUALS OR IN THEIR GROUPS, AND TO PROPOSE NAMES FOR EACH OF THE 38 WARDS.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 As Members are aware, the LGBCE is carrying out an electoral review of the district. LGBCE has completed its consultation on the size of the Council and is minded to recommend a council size of 38. The Commission is not legally bound by that number in its final recommendations as this will depend on the evidence submitted to it during the next stages of consultation.
- 1.2 On 26 March 2013, LGBCE commenced the first period of consultation for a pattern of wards for North West Leicestershire. The consultation period runs between 26 March and 4 June 2013.
- 1.3 The Electoral Review Working Party met on 13 March 2013 when it requested that officers draft a submission in the first instance to ensure that there was no political bias. The submission was to be based on the rules for consideration within the review, as set out in Schedule 2 of the Local Democracy, Economic Development and Construction Act 2009, namely
 - Delivering electoral equality across the district
 - Reflecting the interests and identities of local communities
 - Promoting effective and convenient local government
- 1.4 The Electoral Review Working Party specifically requested that officers not be tasked with naming the wards at this stage.
- 1.5 The Working Party met again on 3 April 2013 when consideration was given to the draft submission. At this meeting Members agreed that the submission be presented to Council for noting with an open invitation to the political groups and individual members to submit their own views and representations in order that the LGBCE can pull all the views and comments together for a final draft submission for the purposes of consultation. The draft submission is attached at Appendix 1.
- 1.6 Detailed maps and supporting documents can be found in the Members' Resources Room for reference. Copies of maps showing the current warding pattern, the proposed submission together with blank maps for plotting alternative warding patterns have been made available to each political group in order to assist should they wish to make their own submissions. Additional documents setting out the current polling district configurations and the projected electorate figures have also been made available.

2.0 WHAT HAPPENS AFTER THE SUBMISSION IS MADE?

- 2.1 The LGBCE will consider all the representations and submissions received before the closing date of 4 June 2013 and will formulate draft recommendations on the warding proposals. These will be published in August 2013.
- 2.2 There will then follow a further 12 week period of consultation on the LGBCE's proposals at the end of which they will publish the final recommendations.
- 2.3 New wards are scheduled to come into effect at the 2015 local elections.

Warding Pattern Submission for North West Leicestershire

Proposal from North West Leicestershire District Council

21 May 2013

1. INTRODUCTION

On 29 March 2011 a report went to Council where it was agreed to request that the Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE) review the Council's electoral arrangements with a view to establishing single member wards to enable the public to have clarity about who represented them at District level and to improve electoral equality. This means as far as is reasonable that each district councillor represents the same number of electors. In addition the further two criteria of effective and convenient local government and community identity have been considered and given equal weight.

The Council formulated the Electoral Review Working Party to lead the Council through the LGBCE process. This cross party working group was convened to consider the current and future district warding arrangements including specific warding options.

This submission provides details of the process followed and describes the case for the future warding arrangements. There are no proposals to change the electoral cycle of all out elections every four years.

2. WELCOME TO NORTH WEST LEICESTERSHIRE

Situated in the north-west of the county of Leicestershire, North West Leicestershire District Council is within close proximity to the major cities of Leicester, Derby and Nottingham. The district is bounded to the east by Charnwood Borough, to the South by the borough of Hinckley & Bosworth and to the north and west by the county of Derbyshire. The area benefits from strong transport links including the M1 and A42 as well as East Midlands International Airport.

Most of the district is now parished following 2 fairly recent community governance reviews. The only areas remaining unparished are Coalville, Greenhill and Thringstone. There are two significantly populated towns: Coalville and Ashby-de-la-Zouch. The remainder of the district consists of rural areas and smaller villages and the largest of these smaller settlements are Castle Donington, Ibstock, Kegworth and Measham. Significant building has occurred in these settlements since the last review and this means that the percentage of the Ashby and Coalville share of the total electorate has reduced from around 43% to 37%.

The estimated resident population as at 2010 is 90,783. 21.3% of the population are of retirement age whilst residents aged 0-15 equates to 19%, 16-24 make up 9.5% and residents aged 25-49 make up 33.5% of the population. Persons aged 50-64 account for the final 16.7% of the population. The electorate of the district is 73,913 as at 10 April 2013.

North West Leicestershire District Council has 38 Councillors representing 20 wards, with 2 political groups. The Council has majority Conservative control with 20 Conservatives and 16 Labour. There is also one Liberal Democrat and one Independent. The Council has adopted a Leader and Cabinet structure.

3. ELECTORAL HISTORY

North West Leicestershire District Council was established following a Local Government reorganisation in 1974. Since the previous Local Government Boundary review in 2002 the district has been served by 38 Councillors representing 20 wards. North West Leicestershire District boundary is coterminous with the Parliamentary constituency boundary.

District Council elections follow an 'all out' approach every four years. This system has been in place throughout North West Leicestershire District's existence and has been recognised as an integral part of the democratic arrangements for both electors and the council.

4. REVIEW PROCESS

A cross party Electoral Review Working Party was established to steer the development of North West Leicestershire District Council's response. The group comprised 3 Councillors from the Conservative Group and 2 Councillors from the Labour Group with a standing invite also going to the single Liberal Democrat councillor in order that views from across the political spectrum could be captured. The Group was chaired by the Leader of the District Council. The Electoral Review Working Party met on 13 March 2013 when it requested that officers draft a submission in the first instance to ensure that there was no political bias. The group specifically requested that officers not be tasked with naming the wards at this stage.

The group met again on 3 April 2013 when consideration was given to the draft submission. At this meeting Members agreed that the submission be presented to Council for noting with an open invitation to the political groups and individual members to submit their own views and representations to the LGBCE. Copies of maps showing the current warding pattern, the proposed submission together with blank maps for plotting alternative warding patterns were made available to each political group in order to assist should they wish to make their own submissions. Additional documents setting out the current polling district configurations and the projected electorate figures have also been made available.

5. COUNCIL SIZE & ELECTORATE FIGURES

The Electoral Review Working Party agreed to submit to full Council and the Boundary Commission a recommendation of 38 councillors which was agreed at the Council meeting on 30 October 2012

The LGBCE confirmed that it was minded to adopt a Council size of 38, reserving the right to increase or decrease the number of Councillors by 1 should a future warding scheme emerge which better reflected the Boundary Commission criteria.

6. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

North West Leicestershire District Council's proposal for the future warding arrangements of the District has considered and had regard to the LGBCE criteria of:

- Electoral equality
- Effective and convenient local government
- Community identity

The key factors in ensuring the LGBCE criteria have been met include:

- Ward sizes have been determined with a range of criteria to ensure they are compact, reflect the geographical features of the area, the community facilities, community identity and the electorate size.
- Single member wards ensure accountability, reflect communities whilst also ensuring ease of access to elected representatives.
- Electoral equality has been achieved where at all possible.
- Where possible we have utilised existing parishes as building blocks for the proposed warding arrangements

As part of the review the Electoral Review Working Party was asked to consider names and it was agreed that all Members be asked to consider appropriate names for their own areas by using geographical references and local knowledge.
