#### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- A CCTV system will be maintained which is fit for the purpose. The system will incorporate
  a camera covering the entrance door and be capable of providing an image which is
  regarded as identification standard.
- The CCTV system will incorporate a recording facility and any recording will be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of one calendar month. A system will be in place to maintain the quality of the recorded image and a complete audit trail maintained.
- The CCTV system will be maintained and fully operational throughout the hours that the premises are open for any licensable activity.
- The precise position of the cameras may be agreed with police from time to time.

#### c) Public safety

The applicant will at all times maintain adequate levels of staff. Such staff levels will be disclosed, on request, to the licensing authority and police.

#### d) The prevention of public nuisance


Adequate waste receptacles for use by customers shall be provided in and immediately outside the premises,

Signage will be displayed at the exit of the premises requesting customers leaving the premises late at night to do so quietly and with consideration so as not to disturb nearby residents.

#### e) The protection of children from harm

All staff will be trained to request evidence of age from any person seeking to buy alcohol and appearing to the member of staff to be under the age of 18. Such evidence is to be of a photographic nature such as a passport or photographic driving licence until other effective identification technology, such as thumbprint or pupil recognition, is introduced.

# Licensing application - Whitwick and Ibstock Filling Stations

I have been contacted by several constituents regarding the proposed licence application for the sale of alcohol at the above premises.

My Ibstock constituent informs me that various incidents occurred on Ashby Road during the late evening of Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> August including a gang of young people congregating around the kiosk creating a noise, car engines revving, car doors slamming, and someone repeatedly kicking security shutters after apparently being refused sale of cigarettes.

My Whitwick constituent reported similar problems of youths congregating near the petrol station late at night causing a disturbance and they already have problems with litter from nearby fast food outlets. They cannot see the need for the filling station to have a liquor licence when there is a public house and off licence in the vicinity.

My constituents are concerned that granting a liquor licence for these premises will further exacerbate the problems already experienced. I therefore support the residents' concerns in opposing these applications.

Regarding: application for licence to sell alcohol 24 hours, 7 days a week by the Jet petrol station, Ashby Road, Ibstock.

Dear Mr S Eyre,

I am writing to strongly object to the above application, my reasons for this are as follows:

- In my opinion, By wanting to sell alcohol beyond normal off licence hours, it
  will clearly increase late night business which will cause greater disturbance
  and noise, which will exceed those considered when the original plans for
  the24 hour petrol station operation were approved.
- Local residents have not been properly consulted or informed on the actual
  petrol station becoming a 24 hour operation and the plan to sell alcohol 24
  hours a day and 7 days a week. This shows a severe lack of consideration
  for the local residents.
- Alcohol being available 24 hours, 7 days a week from these premises, I feel
  will cause an increase in anti social behaviour and become a disturbance to
  local residents on Ashby Road throughout the night, particularly at
  weekends.
- I feel that the sale of alcohol, from these premises, will encourage young
  people to loiter late at night in the street as pedestrian traffic will increase, this
  will only add to the increasing problem of groups congregating around the
  forecourt, especially at late night weekends, since the petrol station began
  opening 24 hours. This is starting to become a concern to some local
  residents.
- I believe there is no need for this type of alcohol licence in a village location when only 2 miles away is Bardon Road filling station and 3 miles away is the Tesco store in Ashby. Both of these sites are located away from residential dwellings and more suitable for this type of retail.
- Normal alcohol licensing hours are served extremely well by 2 local convenience stores situated within a few hundred yards of the filling station. Sam's, Chapel Street, Cost cutters, Leicester road and the Coop store. This must be over saturated for a village location.

- Ibstock has already had some problems with juveniles under age drinking, causing anti social behaviour and criminal damage around the co-op store adjacent to this petrol station, I as a resident, feel that the sale of alcohol throughout the night will increase this problem. Further, this could move the problem to just off the forecourt area surrounding the filling station.
- The village of Ibstock has banned the drinking of alcohol on its streets for some years, something that the local authorities have strived for. I believe the sale of alcohol 24 hours a day will be extremely counter productive against this positive initiative to reduce antisocial behaviour in the village.

I strongly object to the application of a 24-hour alcohol licence at these premises and my views reflect many of the fears of the local residents, who are concerned about the impact on the local environment mainly from anti social behaviour from customers using the late night facility.

This not only includes drunken anti social behaviour but also increased noise from car doors slamming etc and post club/pub group gathering that will occur more frequently at weekends. Again this is already starting to occur and become a nuisance. The sale of alcohol can only aggravate the situation.

Many of the local residents are elderly and some are unsure of the correct procedure to object. There are also a few that were not fully aware that the licence application had been made. Considering that lbstock remains a rural village and is situated at the heart of the National Forest, surely a 24 hour petrol station offering 24 hour alcohol, nestled among residential housing, is not fitting to such a location and would be more suitable for inner city/fringe of town areas.

I once again strongly urge you to reject this application. There is already deep concern regarding the unknown impact with the petrol station becoming a 24 hour operation due to it being located in the centre of a residential area, within the village. This has so far only operated for approximately 6 –8 weeks, which we consider to be far too shorter period to assess the impact on the local community. We feel that adding a 24-hour alcohol licence will magnify potential problems and further damage the sense of local community. I suggest a minimum of at least 12 months before even considering the application of a 24-hour alcohol licence for these premises.
