

I am Police Constable 1887

Since October 2004, I have been Principle Beat Officer for Ashby town centre.

Part of my role is to manage the incidents and crime on my beat, look at problem areas or premises, and ways in which to reduce crime.

I also deal with the night time economy and liaise with the pub and club licensees regarding licensing matters.

Since my time at Ashby, I have worked numerous late shifts at week ends, in the town centre.

Generally, early on in the evenings on a Friday and Saturday, there are very few problems relating to the pubs and the consumption of alcohol.

On the whole, the clientele are good natured and well behaved.

However, since the opening of Arty's Bar, I have noticed that later on in the night, the atmosphere changes, mainly due to the type of customer the club attracts.

It is quite apparent that that a large number of people visiting the club are intoxicated when entering the club, get heavily intoxicated whilst inside, and invariably commit criminal offences in the premises or on leaving.

I have attended the club on many occasions in order to deal with fights and assaults, some that are so serious, the injured parties are required to attend hospital for treatment.

When the club closes at 2am, this obviously causes a large influx of intoxicated people to spill out onto Market Street in one large gathering.

Again, there are frequent fights and damage caused to shop fronts and business premises.

I have examined and produced data stored on the Leicestershire Police I.T. systems, which relate to incidents in and around Arty's Bar from December 2005 onwards.

This clearly shows that the number of incidents which Arty's is responsible for generating, far exceeds any other

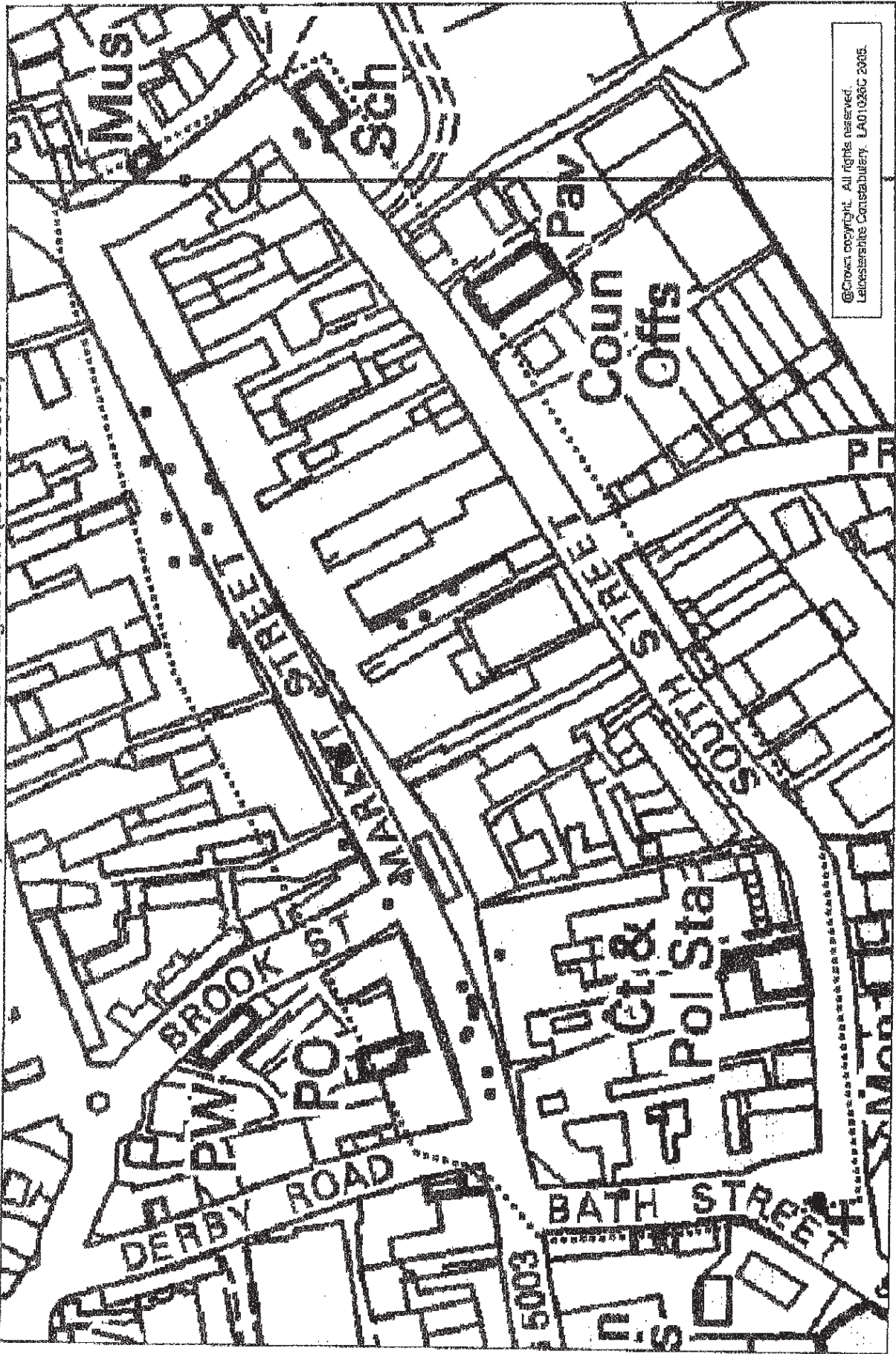



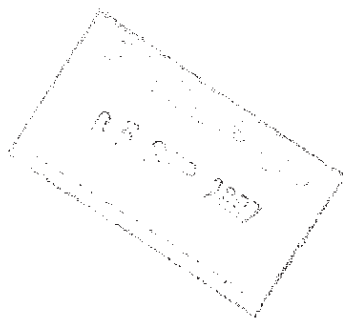

My concerns are as follows:

Volume of Visitors

The volume of traffic and visitors that such an establishment will attract will have a great deal of influence on the local area.

Obviously, this will impact on the privacy of neighbouring properties.

Noise Levels

Given the nature of the business, there will undoubtedly be high levels of noise pollution at anti-social times of the night.

The application for a 4 a.m. license will lead to large numbers of people leaving the premises between 4 and 5 in the morning.

This conflicts with the fact that, nearby properties, my own included, are subject to a restrictive covenant, limiting noise levels.

Public Order Issues

The public order issues that inevitably go with such a venue will disrupt what is currently a pleasant residential area and present a challenge to the already over-stretched local police service.

Conservation Area Status

It is the duty of the local authority to pay special attention to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of a conservation area.

If this development is allowed to go ahead, it will have a detrimental effect on the character of the area.

To quote from the North West Leicestershire District Council Local Plan, section 4.41 POLICY E10 states:

(e) Be detrimental to environmental quality in terms of:

(i) Traffic generation;

(ii) Noise and other forms of environmental intrusion.

Clearly, on these grounds alone this extension to the hours and change to license agreement cannot proceed.

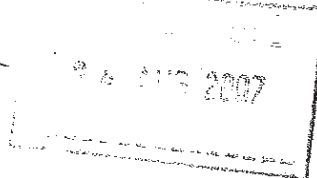

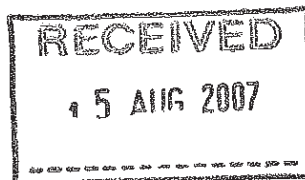

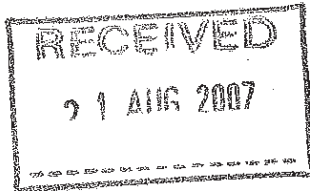
I write to register most strong opposition of my wife and myself to the above application on the following grounds.

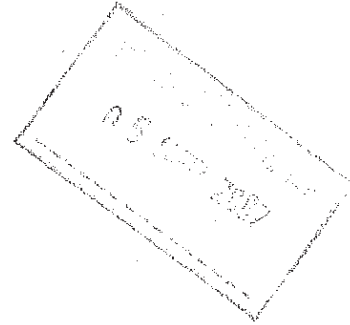

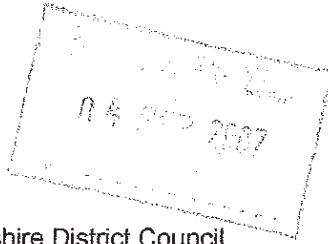

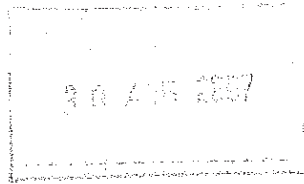

We wish to object to the recent proposed changes to the licence for Arty's Bar on Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

As you will be aware many properties in close proximity to Arty's Bar are residential. Our sleep is already being regularly interrupted due to music and late night revelers leaving Arty's. We understand that at present the Licensing Authority are in agreement for a number of licensed premises to remain open until 1 or 2am but believe that any extension to this late hour will cause further anxiety to local residents.

Having lived at our present address for many years we have seen a gradual relaxation in the licensing hours and a corresponding increase in noise, litter, and acts of mindless vandalism. On a number of occasions we have been woken in the early hours by a commotion in the Lamb Passage outside Arty's and have witnessed drunken youths fighting, swearing, urinating and behaving raucously. Many of these appear to be under age! Following busy nights at Arty's it is common to see broken glass and litter strewn about.

We are aware that bar staff have previously been found to serve under age customers in Arty's and to introduce topless pole dancers into such a poorly managed premises is likely to compound the problems there.

The proposed extension to 4am is completely unacceptable. We also feel this will result in other licensees seeking later hours together with the proprietors of mobile burger vans to compete for business.

We are also concerned that police resources, which are already stretched to breaking point would be unable to cope with this potential public order problem at such a late hour. Whilst some will naively say this is a policing issue we feel it is very much a community problem and it is the local residents who will suffer should the proposed changes be agreed.

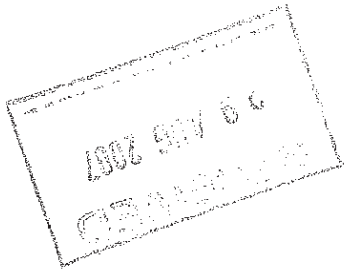

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

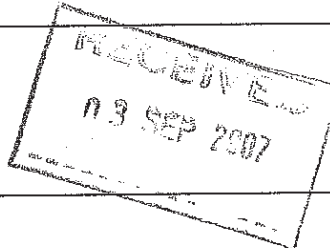

Dear Sirs,

With reference to the above application to extend the hours of trading past the hours of 2am, I am a director of the company that built the 19 apartments adjacent to the bar, I have been approached by the residents of the apartments to lodge a formal objection to the application.

To open the bar later than 2am would be totally unacceptable to the residents, some of whom live less than 16ft away from the bar, some of our residents are pensioners, some are people who work shifts they already put up with excessive noise nuisance till the early hours, this noise nuisance has been exacerbated since the smoking ban has been introduced as customers congregate in the passage between the two buildings.

With reference to the pole dancing our residents feel that it would drastically lower the tone of the area, this is not a city, it is a quiet market town where they have chosen to live.

I do accept that they have chosen "town living" but there has to be a terminal hour that is no longer acceptable, if this application is granted I do feel that the council will be inundated with noise complaints from our residents and the rest of the local community.

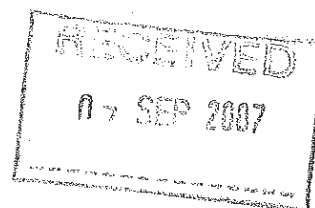

I register my objection to the application for the Public Entertainment Licence amendments for the Arty's 60a Market Street Ashby De La Zouch as per the public notice carried in the Ashby Times

My objection is based on the following;

- Music and revelry noise from this building is currently not eliminated which gives rise to constant noise disturbance to the surrounding residential area which will be further increased if this application is approved.
- This application for proposal of use until 2.0 am each day and 4.00am on Saturdays and Sundays constitutes an intolerable long period and would have a further adverse impact on mine and my neighbours' residences and will escalate the problem that is currently experienced under the existing operating times to every day of the week.
- There would be no avoidance of customers gathering in the immediate areas before, during and after the proposed hours of trading giving rise to the increase in revelry noise and possible incidences of violence and vandalism. This is currently an acknowledged problem in Ashby and due to the increased in night time occupancy of the town may escalate to an uncontrollable level.
- I would refer you to communications from the district council's chief environmental officer ref GEC/VW of 2/12/88 and ref EGG/PTM of 14/4/89 which both make reference to the disturbance caused by music noise emitted from the premises when known as the Symphony bar and refers to the unsuitability of the premises for the purpose of late night entertainment as the noise emissions are of an unacceptable level. The district council subsequently revoked the 2 am license in April 1989 and appeal by the proprietors was rejected.

- I would also refer you to your letter to me of 23rd Dec 2002 ref Lic/Mcl.continental, advising me of the councils Licensing Groups decision of Thursday 19th December 2002, and its conditions in granting the application for a public entertainments license viz.

"The musical amplification system has an in line electronic noise limiter fitted and that it is set to the satisfaction of the Head of the Environmental Protection".

"All openings to the building are acoustically treated to the satisfaction of the Head of the Environmental Protection".

Your statement that "the group has regard for the human rights of local residents"

I have doubt that these conditions have been complied with or enforced.

I feel that this application, if accepted, would cause a further decline in the quality of the residential environment of Ashby Town Centre in particular South Street and Prior Park


Dear Sir /Madam
