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

# Explanatory notes to accompany application for a new Premises Licence in respect of a Youth Hostel.

#### Introduction

YHA (England and Wales) Ltd ("YHA") operate in excess of 200 Youth Hostels across England and Wales. Flint Bishop Solicitors have been engaged to Licence/re-Licence 167 of those hostels. Most of these hostels at the moment either have limited Licences (for example alcohol only subject to restaurant and residential conditions) or no Licence at all. YHA feels that it is necessary that Licences already in force are more comprehensive. Of particular concern to YHA are that most hostels do not enable the provision of regulated entertainment thus making it impossible for them to provide any sort of entertainment at all on a commercial basis (for example to put on folk evenings for residents and to provide for private parties etc ...)

Of those premises which have restrictions on the sale of alcohol YHA would like to be able to sell alcohol more widely. Many Youth Hostels are situated in beautiful rural or prime city centre locations and lend themselves to private parties where alcohol would be supplied. YHA also wish to be able to capture passing trade for example from walkers who would not in most cases, on the current Licences, be able to buy an alcoholic drink.

### Why have applications been made for a new Premises Licence?

In some cases because there is no existing Licence it is necessary. YHA have however decided after consultation with Flint Bishop to apply for new Premises Licences across their estate rather than for variations. Not only is it procedurally simpler, YHA also wish to try and achieve a degree of standardisation of Licences across their estate for management reasons. This is not to say it is appropriate to have the same Licence for each of their premises and where necessary appropriate amendments will be made to the operating schedule to reflect local circumstances particularly to reflect feedback from Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties.

It is also envisaged that there is likely to be a cost saving because of the need not to apply for both a new Premises Licence and a variation of a Premises Licence in the same year.

#### **Plans**

The areas where it is envisaged Licensable Activities may be carried out are edged in red on the plans served with the application. A fairly flexible approach has been taken to ensure that all areas where Licensable Activities may be provided are covered. This in many cases includes the kitchen which is traditionally the heart of the YHA community. It is envisaged that in some limited circumstances, late night refreshment may be provided from this part of the hostel. Other rooms have been included because they may be let out for private functions.

On the whole however most Licensable activities will be carried out from the dining area where in many cases there exists already a bar servery.

# Why have YHA provided for the large range of Licensable Activities which they have and for the times that they have?

Again this is largely to provide for business flexibility. It will remain the case that the most commonly used Licensable Activity will be the supply of alcohol prior to 23.00 hours each day. For reasons which we have already explained above regulated entertainment is required in some limited circumstances. It should be noted however that it is not intended that Licensable Activities will be provided other than to limited categories of persons as identified in the operating schedule after 23.00 hours at night.

## Who is to be the Designated Premises Supervisor?

In many cases, where there is an existing Licence for the premises, the Designated Premises Supervisor will be the existing Designated Premises Supervisor under that Licence. Where however there is not an existing Designated Premises Supervisor or an existing Licence and where a Designated Premises Supervisor consent form has not been returned to Flint Bishop by the deadline agreed between Flint Bishop and YHA on submission of these applications then the Designated Premises Supervisor has been specified to be Harrison Bamber who is an Operations Manager for YHA and who holds a Personal Licence. When the Licences become effective, once granted, applications will be made to vary the Premises Licence to specify a Designated Premises Supervisor who will be a Personal Licence Holder based on site. YHA is currently undergoing a training programme to ensure that they have

appropriate numbers of people who hold the NLCPLH qualification and consequently are eligible to apply for Personal Licences.

Where can copies of the Risk Assessment documentation referred to in the applications be obtained?

We will be very happy to provide copies of the risk assessment documentation referred to in the operating schedule upon request. The documentation is however voluminous and we appreciate that many Responsible Authorities will not automatically wish to have sight of it. Those who do however should please request it and it will be sent by return. It may be most convenient to request the documentation by email, the appropriate email address to use will be

Overseal Parish Council is concerned about those aspects of the application, especially off sales. There have been persistent problems in the village with under age youths getting alocohol and causing social problems when they are 'under the influence'. There need to be strict control measures if the licence is granted so as to prevent problems of this nature arising both close to the site and elsewhere. The Council would not want to restrict the normal licenced activities at the premises such as social events and the like, but are very concerned about the possibility of youths obtaining alochol and then causing a nuisance.

I would be grateful if you would take this message as a formal statement of the views of the Parish Council when determining the application.

I am writing to object to the granting of the licences applied for on the followingh grounds:

Crime and Disorder

The provision of live music and sale of alcohol - on and off the premises - will lead to numbers of youths in a residential area late at night. Crime, anti-social behaviour and vandalism often result from such a mix - with local residents facing the consequences.

**Public Nuisance** 

Loud Music and the late removal of people from the Hostel will cause considerable disturbance. The Local Authority may well also be aware of the rights of local residents and their responsibility? to ensire that noise from such establishment does not reach disturbance levels. Live Music events and the sound equipment invoved invariably reach unnaceptable levels - leading to enforcement action. I have been involved with such a problem in another district - a licence was granted and each weekend the Local authority was called out to enforce acceptable sound levels. Eventually the licence was ammended.

In conclusion - and bearing in mind the restraints from central Government can the following be also noted:

Residents of this area already accept the occasional function appropriately licenced from exisiting facilities. Disturbance is experienced - with loud live music playing, for example,? once or twice in the Summer months which can 'drown out' television in our homes. This is accepted - with good grace- as an occasional disturbance. Gangs of youths, increased traffic, regular noise late into the night and the illegal consumption of alcohol in public places cannot be accepted.

I trust that this objection, at least in part, meets the guidelines which the licensing committee requires.

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

- I would like to state that I have no objection to the licence for hot food and drink being served to residents from 11pm to 5am. If travellers arrive late or leave early it is reasonable to expect sustenance.
- 2. I see no reason why the remaining licences need to be 24hour. Both Conkers and the Miners Welfare manage to provide excellent entertainment while restricting themselves to an 11pm finish and the residents can accept the traffic and other noise etc. created when they know it will end at 11pm. Extensions can be granted on an exceptional basis but that is the point, they should be the exception not the rule.
- 3. I see no reason why a youth hostel should require an off-sales licence. I thought they were places designed to encourage young people and families to enjoy the countryside and promote clean healthy living. This is a very quite rural area. The streets are very dark and there have already been a number of RTAs on it in recent years. Attracting people in to use it as an off-licence is bound to result in more traffic and more, possibly inebrlated, pedestrians in the area. This will in turn, I fear, result not only in causing public nuisance, crime and disorder but an increase in road traffic accidents.
- 4. I would like to see some directive within the licence that Illter will be cleared from the site and adjacent roadside on a daily basis. This is both a health and safety Issue and a public nulsance issue.
- 5. Whilst the licence states that; no licensable activity will be provided between 11pm an 10am the following day other than to; Residents, Guests of residents, Persons attending a function booked 48hours in advance, 1 would like some clarification as to how this is going to be enforced and with what zeal.
- 6. The Ilcense also states that noise and vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties. Again I would like to know how this is going to be measured and enforced.
- 7. Finally it states that the security manual will be maintained and enforced. What does this mean? What does the security manual say? I think this should be spelled out in more detail before this licence is granted. Will there be 24hour security guards? What powers will they have? Will they have any jurisdiction over patrons once off the premises i.e. making nulsance on the adjacent highways or by-ways.
