

Re: Application for Extended Hours Opening - The Woodman, Shortheath Road

I am writing to object to the application for late opening hours on certain days of the week at the above location.

I live directly opposite The Woodman and in the past have had to complain to them about the noise of customers outside the pub and about the loud music. When the music is playing there are times when I cannot hear my television in the living room at the rear of my property. I could certainly not sit in the rooms that front onto the street as the intrusive noise would make it impossible to talk to others or indeed hear conversations.

Increasingly the front of the property, the pavement area, is used by customers to drink and talk. I find it hard to understand how a market town like Ashby-de-la-Zouch has strict regulations about drinking on the streets, but a village like Moira allows this to happen. During the summer period large groups of customers gather outside talking loudly and shouting at times, with total disregard for the residents of the private houses that are opposite, behind and to the side of the public house. Now that there is a smoking ban, again the door is opened and sometimes left open, so that customers can smoke on the pavement area outside the pub. This results in the noise from the pub, including the live music, becoming increasingly loud and intrusive to my peace and quiet.

When the loud music is playing during the summer period I cannot even relax in my garden in the evening as the noise carries across the road and is channelled between the houses to my private garden. The intrusive nature of this is immense and at a time when it would be normal to leave windows open, this becomes impossible due to the loud, intrusive noise.

When the publicans have had evening venues, the front bedrooms of my property are unusable not only because of the above, but also because when the customers leave after the extended hours drinking, they bang car doors; shout to each other across the road; and often stand talking loudly and drunkenly on the pavement outside the pub. This is again showing total disregard for the people living in the area and there seems to be little or no management of this noise by the publicans. There are even times when I have been woken and looked out that I have seen customers urinating on the cars parked in the private car park opposite the terraced houses in Shortheath Road. This can be anything between midnight and 2.00am in the morning.

If the hours are permanently extended I believe that the quality of my life will be drastically changed as every weekend will be disturbed by unruly behaviour and loud noise and music. Recently with the pub being closed frequently, I have realised how much more pleasant it is to live in Moira and certainly in this location. Extended hours drinking and live music can only be detrimental to the village and more specifically to my life at 6 Shortheath Road.. I have a busy career which means I need to go to bed at a reasonable time in order to rise at 6.00am to prepare for work. When the pub has been operating extended drinking, this has affected my sleep and subsequently my health due to the disturbance

Moira is a village in the heart of the National Forest and I find it hard to understand how any council would consider such a disruptive application to be allowed when the quality of the area is supposed to be improved. I have been living opposite this pub for over twenty years and have only had complaints over the last couple of years about the noise and disturbance. The original landlords of the pub were extremely vigilant in ensuring that customers leaving did not disturb local residents. This is certainly not the case today. The pub even has flashing lights which disturb my peace and at one time the music appeared to be piped outside to customers on the pavement causing a massive amount of stress and disturbance to me..

I have never complained directly to the Local Council and only occasionally to the publicans, for fear of reprisals from the customers, or indeed the publicans, but if this application does proceed, in view of the fact that I have now taken action in the form of this letter, I will not hesitate to submit constant complaints if the quality of my life is affected.

I believe that I have taken a risk in having my life disrupted by possible attacks on my property in view of this letter being produced and would expect the council to support me in ensuring confidentiality and ensure that I can live in my property free from abuse, noise, drunken behaviour and late night activity.
