## 1. Background

1.1 The premises currently operate as a newsagents and confectionary store and have the benefit of a premises licence. The premises licence authorises the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises. A copy of the premises licence is attached as appendix 1.
1.2 A map showing the location of the premises is attached as appendix 2.
1.3 The premises licence holders for these premises are Eastcliffe News Shops Limited and the designated premises supervisor is Steven Crowder who holds a personal licence issued by North West Leicestershire District Council.
1.4 On $10^{\text {th }}$ August 2009 an application and supporting documents for the review of the premises licence was received from Leicestershire Constabulary. A copy of the application is attached as appendix 3. The review application relates to the licensing objectives concerning prevention of crime and disorder and the protection of children from harm. The grounds for review are:

- Steven Crowder became the designated premises supervisor (DPS) at this shop in April 2008.
- On the $28^{\text {th }}$ June 2008 police conducted a test purchase operation at the premise sand the sale was refused.
- On the $25^{\text {th }}$ July 2008 police conducted a test purchase operation at the premises and the sale was refused.
- On $28^{\text {th }}$ November 2008 police conducted a test purchase operation at the premises and a 16 year old boy was sold alcohol by a member of staff. He was issued with a $£ 80$ fixed penalty ticket.
- On the $18^{\text {th }}$ April 2009 police conducted a test purchase operation at the premises and the sale was refused.
- On the $24^{\text {th }}$ July 2009 police conducted a test purchase operation at the premises and a 15 year old was sold a bottle of WKD Blue (an alcoholic drink) by the DPS. He admitted making the sale and was issued with an £80 fixed penalty ticket.
- Leicestershire Constabulary recommended that the following conditions are added to the premises licence.

1) $\operatorname{CCTV}$
2) Adoption of Challenge 21 policy
3) DPS take a qualification
4) Container Marking

### 2.0 Representations

2.1 The Licensing Authority is responsible for advertising the review application by prominently displaying a notice at, on or near the premises to which the application relates and at the main offices of the Licensing Authority for not less than 28 consecutive days. The relevant notices were displayed on the premises and in the reception area of the Council Offices, Coalville on $11^{\text {th }}$ August 2009 and remained on display for the following 28 days.
2.2 In respect of the review of a premises licence, the applicant is responsible for serving the application on the premises licence holder and each of the responsible authorities, namely, Fire Authority, Trading Standards Department and the District Council's Health and Safety, Environmental Protection and Planning Sections. Officers are satisfied that the applicant has served all parties as required. No representations have been made by these parties.
2.3 Interested parties in the vicinity of the premises are able to make representations within 28 days of display of the notice of application to the Licensing Authority. No representations have been made by these parties.

### 3.0 Statutory Guidance

3.1 In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is obliged to have regard to Guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. All Licensing Committee members have been provided with a full copy of the guidance document. Officers consider that paragraphs 1.23 to $1.27,2.1$ to $2.19,2.41$ to $2.50,2.51,10.2111 .15$ to $11.21,11.25,11.26$ and 12.1 to. 12.10 may have a bearing upon the application.

### 4.0 Statement of Licensing Policy

4.1 The Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to its own Statement of Licensing Policy. Officers consider that paragraphs 5.2 \& $5.3,7.1 \& 7.2,10.1$ to $10.5,10.8,10.9$, 11.1 to $11.3,12.2 \& 12.3$ may have a bearing upon the application.

### 5.0 Observations

5.1 The Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, which are:

- the prevention of crime and disorder
- the prevention of public nuisance
- public safety
- the protection of children from harm
5.2 The Committee may take such of the following steps, if any, as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
a) Modify the conditions of the licence.
b) Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence.
c) Remove the designated premises supervisor.
d) Suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months.
e) Revoke the licence.
5.3 Any determination made by the Sub-Committee shall not come into effect until the end of the period given for appealing against the decision or if the decision is appealed against, until the appeal is disposed of.
5.4 There is a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court against the decision of the SubCommittee by the applicant, premises licence holder and persons who made relevant representations.

## Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

The permitted hours set out above do not prohibit:

1. During the first twenty minutes after the above mentioned hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
2. The ordering of the alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
3. The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
4. The sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces.
5. Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container and shall not be consumed on the licensed premises.
6. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
7. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence;
(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

6. On the $24^{\text {th }}$ July 2009 police conducted a test purchase operation at the premises and a 15 year old was sold a bottle of WKD Blue (an alcoholic drink) by the DPS. He admitted making the sale and was issued with an $£ 80$ fixed penalty ticket.
7. Whilst not wishing to fetter the Committee's discretion we ask that the following steps be considered in order to address this problem:
(a) A condition that the licensee will ensure that CCTV is installed following advice from the Leicestershire Constabulary Crime Reduction Officer and maintained in accordance with the Information Commissioner's CCTV Code of Practice be added
to the licence. (Where CCTV is aiready in use this will amount to a survey and recommendations from the Crime Reduction Officer. This can prevent as well as detect crime.)
(c) A condition be added that the licensee will adopt the Challenge 21 policy and provide adequate, documented training for staff before they are allowed to serve alcohol. This training will be repeated every three months, in order to retain focus, and records of that training will be provided to Council licensing officers and police on request.
(d) A condition be added that the current Designated Premises Supervisor will obtain a recognised qualification for Designated Premises Supervisors. These courses focus on the role and responsibilities of the DPS above and beyond the syllabus for the level 2 National Certificate for Personal Licence Holders. The Licence holder must provide the licensing authority with sight of the certificate within the next 3 months.
(e) A condition be added that no alcohol will be sold unless the container bears a label identifying the store from which it was sold. (This will assist the responsible authorities in identifying the source of recovered alcohol and containers.)
