Purpose of report	<p>To determine an application for the grant of a premises licence in respect of premises known as the Queens Head and located at 22-24 The Green, Thringstone, Leicestershire, LE67 8NR. This report outlines the application and summarises representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of Government guidance and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.</p>

1. Background

- 1.1 The premises previously operated as a pub under the authorisation of a premises licence however the premises licence lapsed.
- 1.2 On 12th June 2009, an application to grant a premises licence was received from Admiral Taverns (Pyramid) Limited. A full copy of the application form is attached as appendix 1.
- 1.3 A map showing the location of the premises is attached as appendix 2.
- 1.4 The grant application is requesting the following:

Sale of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises, films (indoors), indoor sporting event, live music (indoors), recorded music (indoors), performance of dance (indoors), anything of a similar description to live music, recorded music or performance of dance (indoors), provision of facilities for making music (indoors), provision of facilities for dancing (indoors) and provision of facilities for entertainment similar to making music and dancing (indoors):

Sunday to Thursday – 10.00 to 00.00

Friday and Saturday – 10.00 to 01.00

An additional hour to the standard and non-standard times on the day when British summertime commences.

From the standard start timing on 31st December to the standard start timing on 1st January.

In the event of any transmission of any International sporting event which falls outside of the standard hours, timing to commence 1 hour before the start of the event and ending 1 hour after the end of the event.

An additional hour on Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and Mondays of all Bank Holiday weekends, Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, St Patrick's Day, St George's Day, St David's Day and on 12 other occasions per annum at the the discretion of the premises licence holder.

Opening hours of the premises:

Sunday to Thursday – 9.00 to 01.00

Friday and Saturday – 9.00 to 02.00

An additional 1 hour after the non-standard finish timings for the provision of licensable activities.

Late night refreshment:

Sunday to Thursday – 23.00 to 00.00

Friday and Saturday – 23.00 to 01.00

An additional hour to the standard and non-standard times on the day when British summertime commences.

From the standard start timing on 31st December to the standard start timing on 1st January.

In the event of any transmission of any International sporting event which falls outside of the standard hours, timing to commence 1 hour before the start of the event and ending 1 hour after the end of the event.

An additional hour on Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and Mondays of all Bank Holiday weekends, Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, St Patrick's Day, St George's Day, St David's Day and on 12 other occasions per annum at the the discretion of the premises licence holder.

1.5 The applicant has stated in the operating schedule of the application form that he will take the following steps in order to promote the four licensing objectives:

- The licensing objectives have been carefully considered taking account of the premises and their location.
- The proposed premises will promote the licensing objectives in accordance with Section 182 of the Guidance.
- The premises will operate in accordance with all relevant legislation.
- The proposed premises will not have an adverse effect on any of the licensing objectives.
- The premises will liaise and co-operate with the responsible authorities.
- A proof of age policy will operate in relation to relevant licensable activities.
- A zero tolerance towards illegal drugs will operate at all times.
- Any drinks promotions will not adversely affect the promotion of responsible drinking.
- Customers will be encouraged to leave the premises in a quiet and disorderly manner
- Staff will be trained to observe the measures necessary to promote the licensing objectives.

- In the event that the premises wish to open under their permitted hour for the transmission of a recognised sporting event the licence holder or nominated person shall notify the Police in writing 21 days before the event.
- If the Police serve written notification on the designated premises supervisor 7 days prior to the event it will not go ahead.
- Of the 12 permitted occasions that the premises may open for an additional hour at the discretion of the licensee, the Police must be notified in writing at least 10 days in advance of the event and will be subject to a Police veto on the grounds of crime and disorder.
- The necessary fire safety precautions will be installed and maintained.
- The premises will be adequately ventilated to prevent nuisance.
- Arrangements will be made for the storage and disposal of refuse which do not cause a nuisance.
- Any noise from the licensable activities provided will be monitored to prevent nuisance.
- Non-alcoholic drinks will be available.

2.0 Representations

- 2.1 In respect of a new application, the applicant is responsible for advertising the application by way of a notice in the specified form at the premises for not less than 28 consecutive days and in a local newspaper. The applicant placed notice in the Coalville Times on 19th June 2009 and officers are satisfied that the correct notices have been displayed at the premises.
- 2.2 The applicant is also required to serve a copy of their application on each of the responsible authorities, namely, the Police and Fire authorities, Trading Standards Department and the District Councils Health and Safety, Environmental Protection and Planning Sections.
- 2.3 The Environmental Protection Department raised a representation to the variation application on the grounds of public nuisance. After negotiations with the applicant, the Environmental Protection Department withdrew their representation as the application formally amended their variation application agreeing to the following restrictions:
- 1. The lounge area shall not be used for regulated entertainment.**
 - 2. The terminal hour for all licensable activities shall be midnight except for the inclusion of the non-standard timing conditions contained in the application. The premises to close to the public at 00:30 hours.**
 - 3. No consumption of alcohol shall take place in the external drinking area to the rear of the premises after 23:00 hours.**
- 2.4 There have been no representations from any of the remaining responsible authorities.

2.5 Interested parties in the vicinity of the premises are able to make representations within 28 days of the application to the Licensing Authority.

2.6 Representations have been received from 2 residents in the vicinity of the premises objecting to the variation application on the grounds of public nuisance and prevention of crime and disorder. Copies of their representations are attached as appendices 3 and 4.

3.0 Statutory Guidance

3.1 In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is obliged to have regard to Guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. All Licensing Committee members have been provided with a full copy of the guidance document. Officers consider that paragraphs 2.1 to 2.18, 2.32 to 2.40 and 8.28 to 8.32 may have a bearing upon the application.

4.0 Statement of Licensing Policy

4.1 The Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to its own Statement of Licensing Policy. Officers consider that paragraphs 7.1, 7.2 and 9.1 to 9.3 may have a bearing upon the application.

5.0 Observations

5.1 The Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, which are:

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance;
- the protection of children from harm.

5.2 The Committee may take any of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:

- a) Grant the application as requested.
- b) Modify the conditions of the licence, by altering or omitting or adding to them.
- c) Reject the whole or part of the application.

5.3 There is a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court against the decision of the Sub-Committee by the applicant and persons who made relevant representations.

I am writing to view my concerns I have regarding a licence for the Queens Head, The Green, Thringstone.

Firstly I would like to state that we are situated next door to the Queens Head (we are attached) and we have had ongoing noise issues with the previous landlords since 2004, and we feel that we just go round in circles when complaints have been made in the past.

Living directly next door to the pub you can hear everything, now I don't expect not hear anything at all but when ever entertainment is on (disco's-singers) you would think the entertainment is in my house, that is how clear and loud it is, and I am quite happy to have monitors in my house to prove this point not only that but in the past the noise and entertainment has been known to go on until early hours in the morning.

Having 2 young children one of which is at school I am unhappy for a licence (drinking or entertainment

to be granted until 7AM as customers in the past have been noisy, taxis pull up at pub there horns and people have been known to bang on my windows and door too, this has in the past made it difficult for me and family to sleep.

It was only about a year previous to the pub closing that things started to get better.

Previous landlords have been unapproachable about the matter and I do believe that when I have previously contacted the council they have set guidelines, which have NOT been stuck to i.e. windows and doors being kept shut, entertainment to only be in the bar and finishing before 12.

This is why I do not want a entertainment licence to be granted.

I personally believe the village has been a lot better without the Queens Head and I for I do not want it to re-open but realistically I know I cannot stop it.

I just want reassurances that whoever is opening it up again is going to be respectful, after all we are a quite village NOT a town centre, we do not want a village pub that has music blasting out until 7am and people being loud and drinking until that time.

**Re: Licensing Application in respect of premises known as 'Queens Head Inn,

I find the application for the above premises that has been submitted to be totally unacceptable on the following grounds.

The village of Thringstone has over the past 12 months has seen a drop in low level crime in part due to the fact that the Public Houses in the village ceased trading.

The premises in question are totally unsuitable for live music and entertainments due to the fact they are located in a residential area, adjoining a family houses. Over the past four years my family have been kept awake by the noise of the entertainment well beyond what could be deemed as reasonable. Then to have been disturbed by the Public Houses patrons leaving either shouting, fighting, or spinning the wheels of their vehicles as they depart.

Regular visits from the Police to The Green in Thringstone have been stopped since this Pub closed, and it seems a shame to re-establish this negative image.

The public house has no parking of it's own so its patrons use the car park on The Green, which already on Friday's and Saturdays is overused and the public nuisance to local residents is considerable, as my emails to Lindsay Weaver bear testimony the Community Centre Service Road can be completely blocked by selfish and inconsiderate drivers regularly most weekends.

The state of repair the premises are in, is also questionable and as my home overlooks the front aspect of the Queens Head is a very pertinent, will the new tenants or the brewery be required to repaint the frontage and remove trailing wires etc. from the building?

Whilst I would love to see something done with these premises I believe as this is a mainly residential area that this application be turned down, until the brewery request a reasonable license to run a local pub aimed at local people, not a venue for loud music and entertainments. If this is not a viable option in the current climate, then surely it would make more sense to sell the property to a developer to allow it to be returned to a domestic dwelling.

Finally, it strikes me as very poor service that North West Leicester District Council has not made local residents aware of this application in writing leaving it to word of mouth, as not everybody purchases the Coalville Times, to allow the Council Tax Payers affected by the proposal, the courtesy of expressing their opinions regarding this application.
