P Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)

The Licensee, the person in charge as a manager or supervisor in the premises, shall ensure that all times when the premises are for any licensable activity, there are sufficient competent staff on duty at the premises for the purpose of fulfilling the terms and conditions of the licence and for preventing crime and disorder. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff will undertake training in their responsibilities. Records will be kept of training and refresher training.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Toilets shall be checked an average of two hourly while the premises are open to the public to deter the use of drugs. Details of checks shall be documented and made available to Police on request.

The Licensee already installed comprehensive CCTV coverage at the premises and it is operated and maintained at the premises.

The CCTV system shall conform to the following points:

1. Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance and exit doors both inside and outside.
2. Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification.
3. Cameras viewing till areas must capture frames not less than 50% of screen.
4. Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises.
5. Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed.
6. Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image.
7. Provide good quality images –colour during opening times.
8. Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises.
9. Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet.
10. Have a monitor to review images and recorded picture quality.
11. Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture retention.
12. Have signage displayed in the customer area to advise that CCTV is in operation.
13. Digital images must be kept for 31 days.
14. Police will have access to images at any reasonable time.
15. The equipment must have a suitable export method, e. G. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy, if this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request.

A monitored alarm system (to EU 50131, which is capable of confirmation) shall be installed at the premises.

Attached evidences from the Applicant indicate that those responsible for the management and conduct of the business does demonstrate the necessary responsibility and mindset to manage confrontational incidents.

c) Public safety

Appropriate fire safety procedures are in place including fire extinguishers (foam, H2O and CO2), fire blanket, internally illuminated fire exit signs, numerous smoke detectors and emergency lighting (see enclosed plan for details of locations). All appliances are inspected annually. All emergency exits shall be kept free from obstruction at all times.

The maximum numbers of persons including staff to present in licensed premises shall not exceed numbers specified from time to time by the LFEPA.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

All customers will be asked to leave quietly.

Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed to remind customers to leave quietly and have regard to our neighbours.

e) The protection of children from harm

A suitably worded sign of sufficient size and clarity must be displayed at the point of entry to the premises and in a suitable location at the point of sale, advising customers caution for hot food and drink.



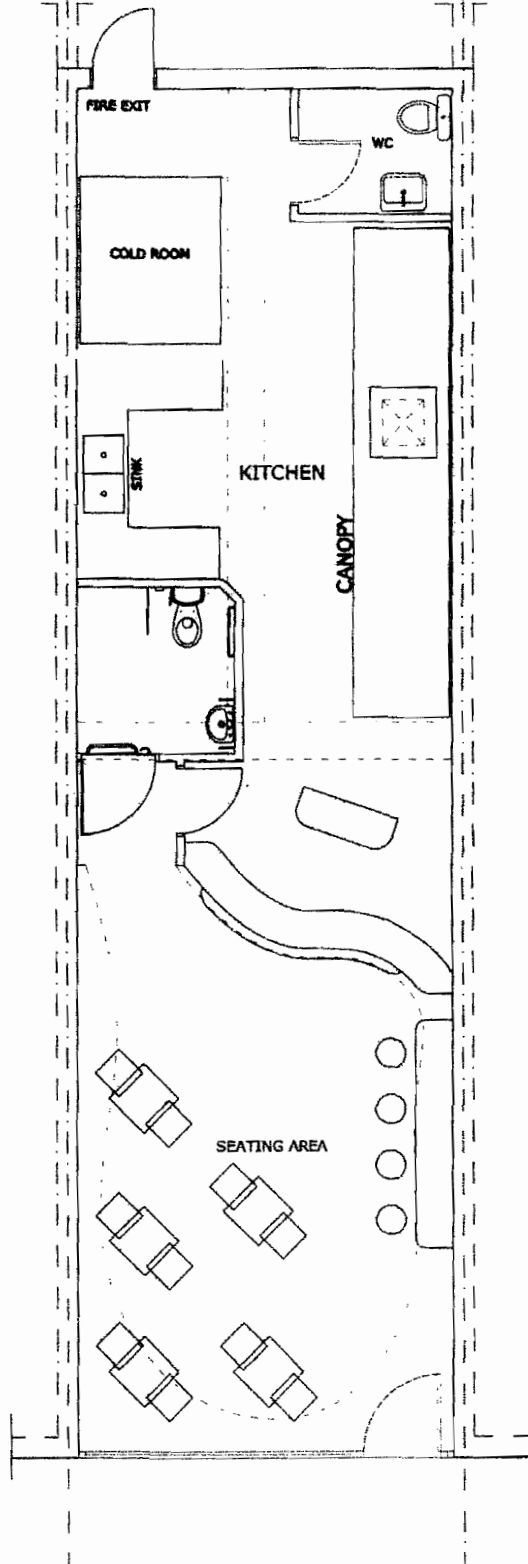

2. To prevent a risk to public safety, tables and chairs will be removed to storage after 23:00 hours. no toilet facilities shall be allowed for the use of patrons after 23:00 hours. Takeaway service only after 23:00 hours everyday. (no customers to be allowed to consume food on the premises, either standing or seated at tables, after 23:00)
3. The premises will complete and retain an incident book that will be made available to Police and local authority upon request. The book will detail time, date, location, a précis of the incident, details of police officers attending, known injuries, name (if known) / description of persons involved.

<p>North West Leicester District Council has adopted a Special Policy in relation to applications for new licences and material variations in this location. The effect of this policy is set out in the Council's current policy.</p> <p>Paragraph 3.15 of that policy states:</p> <p>“The effect of the special policies will be to create a rebuttable presumption that applications for new premises licences or club premises certificates, or material variations, will normally be refused. It will be for the applicant to demonstrate that the premises will not add to the existing cumulative impact. Applicants will need to address this matter in their operating schedules.”</p> <p>Paragraph 13.25 in the current Guidance, issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act, states,</p>

"In some areas, where the number, type and density of premises selling alcohol for consumption on the premises are unusual, serious problems of nuisance and disorder may be arising or have begun to arise outside or some distance from licensed premises. For example, concentrations of young drinkers can result in queues at fast food outlets and for public transport. Queuing in turn may be leading to conflict, disorder and anti-social behaviour."

In our view this describes the situation which will arise if the application is granted.

Our advice to the Licensing Authority is to refuse this application.

The local police make this representation in line with the NWLDC Saturation Policy, and in relation to three of the licensing objectives, these being Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, and Prevention of Public Nuisance.

Our objections are based on the five following points:

1. At this present moment in time, Ashby town centre has seven late night hot food take-away premises, these being Zamani's Pizza, New Wing Wa, CK House, Ashby Fish Bar, Ashby Grill, Captain Kev's Burger Bar, and the applicant's.
Three of the premises (Ashby Fish Bar, Ashby Grill and Captain Kev's Burger bar), all have a licence to operate until 2.30am.
In my opinion, these three premises are more than adequate in relation to the amount of people on Market Street at 2am on Friday and Saturday nights.
2. The previous business that operated at the applicant's premises, traded until 11pm.
To the best of my knowledge, there were no incidents of crime and disorder here, and I believe this was successful, due to its earlier closing time.
The previous business was busy up until 11pm, and gave ample time for people leaving the pubs earlier, to purchase hot food.
3. Due to the amount of licensed premises, people are attracted to the town centre, and the local community has to endure more than its fair share of alcohol fuelled crime, disorder and Anti-Social Behaviour.
There are numerous private dwellings, including OAP complexes, in and around the town.
On speaking to the local residents, they frequently quite rightly complain about how their life is affected at week ends, due to intoxicated people.
These people subject the local residents to noise, vandalism, theft, litter and mess, therefore causing them the inconvenience of having to clear up, lack of sleep and general stress.
If the applicant was allowed to open until 2.30am, this would increase public nuisance and have even more of a detrimental affect on the local community.
4. The premises remaining open until 2.30am, will encourage intoxicated people to gather both inside and outside, making it a further flashpoint for disorder.
The three current late night take-aways are just about manageable to police, with the resources available to us.
The granting of a 2.30am licence would no doubt see an increase in crime and disorder.
An extra premises operating at this time would also put extra demand on the CCTV operator, monitoring the town centre. This would also impact on the monitoring of other areas within the district.
5. As previously mentioned, the demand on police resources to effectively keep both the local community

and people using the night time economy safe is already high. and granting the applicant a 2.30am licence will require additional officers outside the said premises.

This will no doubt impact on preventing crime and disorder, and on the affects of public safety in Ashby. as well as North West Leicestershire as a whole.

Leicestershire Police currently has to make savings of 20% on its annual budget.

To conclude, it is obviously for the applicant to persuade the Licensing Committee that they grant the variation.

We have not heard anything from them that will further assist us in preventing crime and disorder, increasing public safety and preventing public nuisance.

In my opinion, granting the applicant a licence to open until 2.30am will further add to the problems we encounter and have to deal with, every week end in Ashby town centre.

On the basis of my points made, I ask that the Licensing Committee refuse this application.

The following views are made on behalf of over 100 members of the Ashby de la Zouch Civic Society. As you are aware there is an ongoing problem of late night crime and disorder, public nuisance and violence in Ashby de la Zouch town Centre.

This has been contained by the imposition of a special saturation policy for the Town Centre.

We wholeheartedly support this policy which would normally refuse all new licences.

NWLDC council recently consulted on the residents attitudes to takeaways in Ashby. The civic society has recently run a survey amongst its members and 96% of respondents suggested that takeaways should close no later than 11.00pm.

The town council has adopted a policy of opposing late night licenses.

We would conclude on the information available that there is no justification, especially in light of the saturation policy to allow this licence application.

The authority seeks to achieve a balance between leisure and entertainment and the needs of local residents. The key licensing objective of late night refreshment is the prevention of crime, disorder and public nuisance.

A late night licence extension for these premises will encourage disorder and anti-social behaviour by concentrating crowds of young people exiting different local public houses in and around the premises.

Experience of Ashby shows that, when young people having consumed alcohol in different pubs, meet in the street, there occurs threatening behaviour, violence and damage to property. These premises would be a focus for these people.

There are several residential, over shop flats and residential houses in this area who would be subject to disturbance and the trading hours allowed should reflect this. The impact on residents in the vicinity of a late licence and people entering and leaving the premises would be disproportionate and unreasonable.

The cumulative effects of litter will cause a public nuisance. Spilt and discarded food by drunken customers would be a health and slippage hazard to pedestrians.

We are of a mind to understand the public benefit of such an establishment in offering a "chill out" facility and service to late night visitors to the town centre. However on balance we feel that an extension until 2.30am would cause unreasonable public nuisance and encourage crime and disorder. We would remind the Authority that all previous applications for a late night licence for these premises have been refused. We would ask that the Council maintain this stance.

We therefore request that this late licence application is refused.
