Purpose of report	To determine an application for variation of a premises licence in respect of premises, Ashby Fish Bar, Ashby De La Zouch, Leicestershire, LE65 1AH. Background

- 1.1 The premises are a town centre take-away facility which has the benefit of a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003. A copy of the premises licence is attached as **appendix 1.**
- 1.2 A map showing the location of the premises is attached as **appendix 2.**
- 1.3 An application for variation of the premises licence was received on the 9th March 2012 from Mr Aydin Ozdemir. A copy of the application is attached as **appendix 3**.
- 1.4 The variation of premises licence is detailed as follows.

Provision of late night refreshment

Current permitted licensable activity is Fridays and Saturdays 23:00 to 02:30hrs the following morning. The application is to extend the terminal hour on Fridays and Saturdays to 03:30hrs.

1.5 The applicant has specified steps that they will take in order to promote the four licensing objectives.

The prevention of crime and disorder:

- CCTV cameras installed at the premises.
- Customers attempting to cause any trouble will be asked to leave the premises.

The prevention of public nuisance:

Customers to be served as quickly and efficiently as possible.

Public safety:

• All areas to be kept clean and tidy and be continuously cleaned and cleared.

2.0 Representations

- 2.1 In respect of a variation application, the applicant is responsible for advertising the application by way of a notice in specified form at the premises for not less than 28 consecutive days and in a local newspaper. The applicant placed notice in the Ashby Times on 16th March 2012 and Officers are satisfied that the correct notices have been displayed at the premises.
- 2.2 The applicant is also required to serve each of the responsible authorities, namely, the Police, Fire Authorities, Trading Standards Department and the District Council's Health and Safety, Environmental Protection and Planning Sections. Officers are satisfied that the applicant has served all parties as required.
- 2.3 There has been one representation from the Leicestershire Constabulary on the grounds of prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and the prevention of public nuisance. A copy of the representation is attached as **appendix 4.**
- 2.4 Interested parties in the vicinity of the premises are able to make representations within 28 days of display of the notice of application to the Licensing Authority. One representation has been received from an interested party based on crime and disorder, public safety and the prevention of public nuisance. A copy of the representation is attached as **appendix** 5.

3.0 Cumulative Impact

- 3.1 The premises are situated in Market Street, Ashby De La Zouch which is within the area of the special policy on cumulative impact referred to in the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 3.2 The effect of adopting a special policy of this kind is to create a rebuttable presumption that applications for new premises licences or club premises certificates or variations will normally be refused, following relevant representations, unless the applicant can demonstrate in their operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives.
- 3.3 The Licensing Authority recognises that this policy cannot be absolute and will consider each application properly on its merit and those that are unlikely to contribute to the cumulative impact problems will be approved.

4.0 Statutory Guidance

4.1 In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is obliged to have regard to Guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. All Licensing Committee members have been provided with a full copy of the guidance document. Officers consider that paragraphs 2.1 to 2.18, 2.19, 2.32 to 2.40, 3.32 to 3.39, 8.5 to 8.11 and 13.29 to 13.32 may have a bearing upon the application.

5.0 Statement of Licensing Policy

5.1 The Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to its own Statement of Licensing Policy. Officers consider that paragraphs 2.1, 2.3 to 2.6, 3.1 to 3.10, 4.1 to 4.3, 5.1, 5.3, 7.1, 7.2, 8.1, 8.2, 9.1 to 9.3, 12.1 and 17.3 may have a bearing upon the application.

6.0 Observations

- 6.1 The Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, which are:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder;
 - the prevention of public nuisance;
 - public safety;
 - the protection of children from harm.
- 6.2 The Committee may take such of the following steps, if any, as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a) Grant the application as requested.
 - b) Exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates.
 - c) Reject the whole or part of the application.
 - d) Add any conditions necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 6.3 There is a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court against the decision of the Sub-Committee by the applicant, premises licence holder and persons who made relevant representations.




- 1. The licensee shall ensure that the premises are well managed and take steps to deal with disorderly or unruly behaviour occurring at the premises.

SUBJECT: Objection to variation of Licensing hours – Ashby Fish Bar 83 Market
Street Ashby De La Zouch

Sir,

I refer to a recent application for a variation to the licensing hours of the above-mentioned premises.

In any application for a premises license I base any reasoned objection on the principles of licensing law paying specific regard to: The Prevention of Crime and Disorder, The promotion of Public Safety, Preventing Public Nuisance and Preventing Harm to Children.

Ashby Fish bar is located within a popular location of Ashby Town and as such enjoys a large volume of clientele. Its location is close to high volume drinking establishments and it sits within a saturation zone.

This representation is made in line with the NWLDC cumulative Impact Policy (saturation zone) and in respect of three of the aforementioned licensing objectives, excluding protection of children.

There are 72 licensed premises in Ashby 18 of which are already operating within the saturation zone. Most of these premises serve alcohol and many are open from 11am in the morning, until 11 or 12 midnight. Others remain open until 1am or 2.30am. This provides more than ample opportunity for both local people and visitors to Ashby plenty of time to socialise, drink, and enjoy themselves.

The objections against this application and variation of hours are based on the following:

I consider that there is a significant risk that to agree the extension of licensing hours for this premises will considerably increase risks of violence (i.e. crime) and anti-social behaviour (i.e. disorder) in the locality and will also contribute to public nuisance if the premises were permitted to offer food during the additional hours sought at the specified location.

I recognise Licensing law is not a mechanism for the general control of anti-social behaviour by individuals once those individuals are <u>beyond</u> the direct control of an individual club or business holding a licence.

However the applicant has failed to demonstrate in their operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives. The applicant seems reliant on the fact they will be offering a speedy delivery service and will keep their own premises clean in support their application.

CCTV is mentioned within their operating schedule <u>but</u> these already form the existing conditions of the current premises license and are an 'irrelevant consideration' in this application nor should be used to support it.

The applicant is quite correct in citing that a nearby club has been allowed to have its hours extended. However the applicant is perhaps <u>less aware</u> that Police have strongly objected to this and have sought appeal against this decision through the Magistrates courts.

After clubs close late night refreshment houses become the focal point for drunks and rowdy individuals. These individuals are routinely seen discarding food, kicking rubbish about and jumping about. They generally behave in what can only be described as a deplorable manner. They are loud, rude and generally intimidating towards sober members of the public.

Given that most if not all customers are heavily intoxicated and merely seek to obtain food in order to soak up vast quantities of consumed alcohol, such gatherings promote arguments which result in skirmishes ranging from minor antisocial behaviour to large fights and serious injury. All of these incidents impact in the form of pubic nuisance and safety against the law abiding patrons.

Clubs and other establishments often expel customers during the early hours and these persons will congregate near food outlets. While the Police routinely and regularly patrol Market Street and Ashby town to prevent or minimise the potential for drink related violent crime it is extremely difficult to manage incidents of public order faced with inordinate numbers of drunken persons found loitering outside these establishments. Ashby fish bar is not different to other premises often referred to as takeaways.

Most members of the public should be afforded a degree of protection from hostility and nuisance. By allowing this application and extension to hours I believe this will encourage others to loiter and congregate for longer periods thereby increasing the risk of violent confrontations. This behaviour often incites incidents of discord culminating in fights where innocent parties are injured and are representative of significant flash points for violence associated with ASB.

It has been noted that that the applicant seeks to provide food and use communication skills in order to encourage customers to leave after receiving food. This has little to do with the promotion of licensing objectives and does not demonstrate that the applicant will not negatively impact on the cumulative impact policy.

I have 25 years service in Leicestershire Constabulary all of which has been undertaken as a front line operational Police officer. I have been a Sergeant since 1994 representing 18yrs in this rank. From 2007-2009 I was the licensing Sergeant responsible for Loughborough Town centre and the night time economy within this area. I hold the British Institute of Innkeepers NCPLH certificate as a qualification.

During my service I have benefitted from working in all areas of Leicester City and most of the county and I can say that where late night refreshment hour's are increased it significantly leads to drunken and rowdy persons congregating outside these establishments or within the premises itself.

Drunken revellers often jostle and push simply to enter the late night refreshment houses which often resulting in nasty assaults occurring in or around those premises. This behaviour significantly impacts on Crime and Disorder.

Food is often dropped in the street or thrown at passing motorists while customers wait for friends to be served. Concentrations of young drinkers can result in queues at fast food outlets. Queuing in turn may lead to conflict, disorder and anti-social behaviour.

While more flexible licensing hours may reduce this impact by allowing a more gradual dispersal of customers, increasing this premises licence will have the opposite effect and create concentrations of individuals who seek to order food rather than dispersing which generates a catalyst for associated disorder, nuisance and the safety of others.

Nearby shop entrances can and are often used as urinals by both sexes. Vomit, waste food and urine can be seen in the streets and on the pavements well after these premises have closed which promotes Public Nuisance and Public Safety.

The applicant cites in their operating schedule they will continually clean and tidy. This is necessary within their premises for public health reasons although in all of my serving years while covering night time economy I have yet to see any staffs from these types of establishments operating a cleaning schedule on a 'continuous basis' directly outside their premises, especially while customers are seeking to purchase food.

I am deeply troubled about the impact of discarded food, vomit and bodily fluids generated by customers hanging about outside these establishments (in or around) which is common place during the early hours. To increase the licensing hours will simply promote the problem of public nuisance.

If these premises are allowed to remain open until 3.30am (representative of an extra hours trading) it is the view that this will further undermine the licensing objectives and lead to incidents of violence and public disorder.

I believe that granting this license will create more public nuisance issues regarding litter and discarded food in Market Street and the surrounding areas. The dropping of food encourages vermin to gather leading to potential spread of disease which further undermines the promotion of public safety.

While I have no reason to seek any license holder to loose custom I would urge the Licensing Committee to carefully consider this applications for variation of existing license terms.

I have seen nothing from the applicant that can justify the extension of their current licensing hours or how they will prevent crime and disorder, increase public safety, and preventing public nuisance.

In my opinion any extension to the licensing hours will merely add to and increase the problems we encounter most weekends in Ashby town centre and it is on this basis I ask that the Licensing Committee refuse this application.

The previous list of incidents of note from CCTV log book compared to those incidents <u>actually</u> reported to Police in the given x6 dates.

It may be worth noting that clearly CCTV has recorded more incidents in their log book than those that have been reported to us on these dates. This may simply be down to the fact the victims of these types of incidents have merely left Ashby and not bothered to report matters.

Although CCTV may have recorded an incident in their log book they may not necessarily have contacted the Police using their own airwave radio terminals and judged that the incident had dispersed or calmed sufficiently to avoid calling Police assuming Police were available.

Trusting this is of some use.

SUBJECT: Increasing Incidents of Disorder In Market Street Ashby

As an addendum to the objections raised by the Police I would ask that the Licensing committee also consider the following:

The attached email and documents from PCSO Ball demonstrate that CCTV monitoring appears to record a significantly higher number of events occurring in Market Place Ashby than those actually reported to the Police.

CCTV operators are required to record in a book what they are viewing with regard to interest. This material footage is only retained for 31 days. PSCO Ball was asked to look at x6 days in the December 2011. These were chosen as they represented T.E.N dates submitted by some licensed premises within the saturation zone.

CCTV is has ONLY recorded incidents occurring in Market Street Ashby De La Zouch and not the surrounding areas of the town.

The 9th, 16th and 23rd of December represent Friday evenings while the 25th was a Sunday and the 31st (New Years Eve) was a Saturday.

During the six dates mentioned a total of 32 recorded incidents were documented in the CCTV operator's log. A copy of this log can be produced.

These dates and incidents in the CCTV log were compared to Police Incident reporting systems (STORM) aligned to the same dates. Only x3 of these recorded CCTV log book entries correlated with actual Police reports. These have marked the x3 incidents that mirror Police reports with an asterisk.

This figure of x3 reported incidents in 32 is representative of <u>less than 10%</u> of the total number of incidents actually reported to Police covering this period of <u>6 days</u>.

There may be several reasons why incidents are not reported to the Police and PCSO Ball indicates a few within his email.

Others may simply be down to the fact when Police arrive or where they are sent to, stumble across or witness & intervene before matters worsen, individuals involved may not wish to complain, see the error of their ways and disperse or alternatively are given warnings and leave the area. When officers have not witnessed confrontations and have been sent because CCTV indicated an incident had occurred there is often no complaint by parties and all details are refused. The necessity to record such matters does not fall within the NCRS (National Crime Recording Standards) where details of parties or those involved is unknown or they cannot be traced.

It is worth noting that Market Street is only one road of several within the Cumulative Impact area which also covers, North Street, South Street, Bath Street, Derby Road and the associated alley ways off Market Street.

There appears to be a significantly higher number of incidents involving Crime and Disorder, Public safety and Nuisance occurring within the cumulative impact area in Ashby that are not actually being reported to the Police and I would seek that the Licensing committee give due consideration to these facts when considering any further variations involving increasing license hours within Ashby town.

Licencing Application REF: Ashby Fish Bar

The following views are made on behalf of over 100 members of the Ashby de la Zouch Civic Society voted approval at our March meeting.

As you are aware there is an ongoing problem of late night crime and disorder, public nuisance and violence in Ashby de la Zouch town Centre.

This has been contained by the imposition of a special saturation policy for the Town Centre.

We wholeheartedly support this policy which would normally refuse all new licences.

We would conclude on the information available that there is no justification, especially in light of the saturation policy to allow this licence application.

The authority seeks to achieve a balance between leisure and entertainment and the needs of local residents. The key licensing objective of late night refreshment is the prevention of crime, disorder and public nuisance.

A late night licence extension for these premises will encourage disorder and anti-social behaviour by concentrating crowds of young people exiting different local public houses in and around the premises. Experience of Ashby shows that, when young people having consumed alcohol in different pubs, meet in the street, there occurs threatening behaviour, violence and damage to property. These premises would be a focus for these people.

There are several residential, over shop flats and residential houses in this area who would be subject to disturbance and the trading hours allowed should reflect this. The impact on residents in the vicinity of a late licence and people congregating around this street stall premises would be disproportionate and unreasonable.

The cumulative effects of litter will cause a public nuisance. Spilt and discarded food by drunken customers would be a health and slippage hazard to pedestrians.

We are of a mind to understand the public benefit of such an establishment in offering a "chill out" facility and service to late night visitors to the town centre. However on balance we feel that an extension until and 3.30am at weekends would cause unreasonable public nuisance and encourage crime and disorder.

We therefore request that this late licence application is refused.
