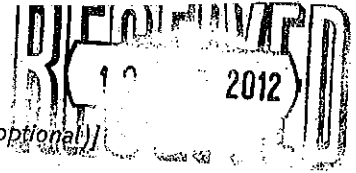

There will be a maximum of 26 days on which licensed events are held per year (this refers to any of the areas listed in the main Areas and incidental areas). Bodies that are permitted by Ashby de la Zouch Town Council to use the areas as specified in Part 1 under this licence will be required to sign an agreement that would incorporate a range of conditions, including to have a risk assessment for events and an emergency management plan. A reasonable amount of public notification will be given prior to the event happening, through normal promotional channels eg. posters, flyers, press releases etc

b) **The prevention of crime and disorder**

Users of Ashby de la Zouch Town Council licence would be required to inform the Police and Leicestershire County Council (Emergency Planning Team) of their event a period of time prior to the event, the Town Council would make the user aware of this.

c) **Public safety**

A risk assessment and emergency management plan would be required to be undertaken by organisers of events which take place under this licence. Users of Ashby de la Zouch Town Council's licence would be required to inform the Police, Fire Authority and Leicestershire County Council (Emergency Planning Team) of their event a period of time prior to the event, the Town Council would make users aware of this, who to contact and in what time scale

d) **The prevention of public nuisance** May should be contacted.

There will be a maximum of 26 days on which licensed events are held per year (this refers to any of the areas listed in the main Area and incidental Areas). Events will not be able to start before 09:00 and will be required to finish by 22:00 on days notified to licensing authority with a minimum of 7 days notice given. Liaison with the Environmental Protection team will occur and advice will be sought and acted upon.

e) **The protection of children from harm**

A risk assessment and emergency management plan would be required to be undertaken by organisers of events which take place under this licence. All performers details will be made available to the Town Council, if the Town Council is not satisfied with the information in relation to the protection of children then the event will not proceed under this licence or the organisers will be advised to make alternative arrangements.

The Bath Grounds is already an alcohol free zone due to past problems with crime and disorder when the use of alcohol in the grounds was permitted. Currently there are occasional incidents of wilful damage to property in and around the grounds but there is a significant risk of this increasing if the use of alcohol is permitted.
<b>Public Safety</b>	The consumption of alcohol is a proven cause of increased risk to public safety due to the effect it has of fuelling minor incidents into more serious ones. Again this is a large outdoor area, which would be difficult to police effectively, particularly after daylight hours, without considerable cost.

Last week I met with Stephen and had the opportunity to view the license application for the above location.

As we discussed at the time I am fully supportive of occasional restricted and well managed events being held in the bath grounds. However I do not believe the application as it stands is appropriate for this location and would like to make formal representation.

The use of the bath grounds for large scale events, including structures, marquees, festivals with live music, vehicles etc. in excess of 20 days (potentially every summer weekend) represents a significant change of use for this location. It would have an equally significant effect on residents and the public.

There should be a restriction on the number of attendees at these events.

Furthermore, I do not believe that the application has outlined sufficient steps to promote the four licensing objectives.

My concerns are as follows:

**1. In relation to 'the prevention of crime and disorder'**

I am concerned that there are insufficient plans within this application to prevent an increase in disorder resulting from the number of 'party goers' / event attendees.

Ashby already has special restrictions in place, extending to south street, that are a result of disorderly behavior and violence. Allowing regular events with alcohol in the bath grounds could move some of these problems to this area.

Historically we have experienced vandalism and aggressive behavior at the rear of our property where the path from the bath grounds runs to South Street. There have been

issues of youths drinking, throwing bottles into our garden and leaving broken glass around the seating area. There is very little policing of this area.

Regular use of the bath grounds for these events, endorsing the drinking of alcohol is likely to increase the problem on a general level.

There are no plans indicated in the application to control the attendees before and after an event and to ensure the area is policed.

There should also be restrictions on the number of attendees at the events and measures in place to manage non-ticket holders in the area.

## **2. In relation to 'public safety'**

There is a clear risk to Public safety at these events if the area is not properly managed. During recent events there seems to have been a low level of attention to this area.

e.g. at the recent circus held in the Bath grounds the general public were not restricted from walking amongst the construction vehicles, guy ropes etc. substantial lifting equipment and haulage vehicles were left to maneuver in a general park area - safety was left to the event organizer without permanent council presence.

Similar, poorly managed vehicle movements have been apparent at tractor rallies etc.

## **3. In relation to the 'prevention of public nuisance'**

It is clear that regular events with amplified music will cause a significant noise nuisance. There should be some limits in place on the level of acceptable noise. It should be noted that these events will be a less than 100m from Rawdon Terrace and as listed buildings there is no double glazing to attenuate the sound levels.

In particular any noise should be restricted to before 7pm during school nights and 9pm at the weekend. It would also be unreasonable to have this type of noise occurring every weekend in the summer.

There should also be consideration given to the noise following an event i.e. when several hundred people all leave the venue at the same time. These type of events also require assembling and dismantling. The times for this activity should be restricted. The recent circus event was dismantling with heavy equipment until 3.30 in the morning preventing our children from sleeping.

## **4. In relation to the 'protection of children from harm'**

The park is a public area and is used by many local children. There is already an issue of litter and broken glass in the area and there is potential for an increased risk. We have previously found glass bottles embedded in the grass.

The area around these events should be properly restricted to prevent children accessing construction sites.

I do not believe there are adequate plans in place to address this issue.

<b>To prevent public nuisance</b>		My garden backs on to the bath grounds and holding large events on this area could increase the possibility of damage to my property, acts of burglary etc which could go unseen if large numbers are gathering. I am also concerned about loud music and noise a few feet from my garden which will hamper my enjoyment of my garden and property. Excessive noise from loud music and revellers will cause nuisance on a major scale as we already have evidenced from other, smaller, establishments. Following

	<p>the recent circus held on the Bath Grounds my family were awoken in the early hours of the morning by large lorries making their way from the grounds. Prior Park Road was then left covered in inches of mud down its whole length making walking very hazardous. The grounds themselves were extensively damaged. The clean up operation must have cost a considerable amount – far exceeding, I would think, any income made from the event.</p>

Please find below my objections for the License Application for The Bath Grounds, Ashby de la Zouch.  
Application for 26 days entertainment over the year. Drinks and entertainment from 9 am.

I would like to express my strong objections for granting this application.

Whilst I am happy to see the public space used for the occasional community activity, I see 26 days (of which most would be over the summer months and at weekends) as far too many.

I also see the license for alcohol completely unnecessary and of great risk and concern.

In relation to crime and disorder, I have had my fence vandalised and broken by youths on the park and have had to call the Police to assist me, when even when asked to stop, they would not.

I have witnessed a young man wrecking his girlfriend's car when parked on the royal hotel car park, whilst having a row. I see that where there are crowds using the park and drinking, this would increase.

In relation to public safety, I have had cans and bottles thrown over my fence, into my garden, which backs onto the park.

Being a regular walker on the grounds, I have also witnessed several glass bottles being pushed into the ground, only to be smashed during the mowing, causing a great risk of injury to people, dogs and children. There is an increase risk that more of this would occur.

Broken glass is already a hazard.

In relation to public nuisance, whenever groups of kids gather on the park, they use the path at the backs of our gardens as a public toilet. There is also noise and a great deal of litter left to be cleared by somebody else. Grouping together they can be very intimidating.

In relation to children's safety the litter, glass bottles and unwelcome behaviour would be a threat to children living on the terrace and near by and those using the park.

I do not see even the daily activities of the park managed at the moment, in the summer months no punishment is given despite a great deal of litter being left. People are regularly seen drinking alcohol on the park, despite signs saying no drinking. At these events I am concerned that they would not be managed and our safety, privacy, properties, peace and quiet would be greatly effected. There would also be noise, smell and light pollution to the residence of the terrace.

Having protected the town centre from previous considerable trouble, years ago, this license would risk pushing trouble out into a residential area and where it is less likely to be managed appropriately.
