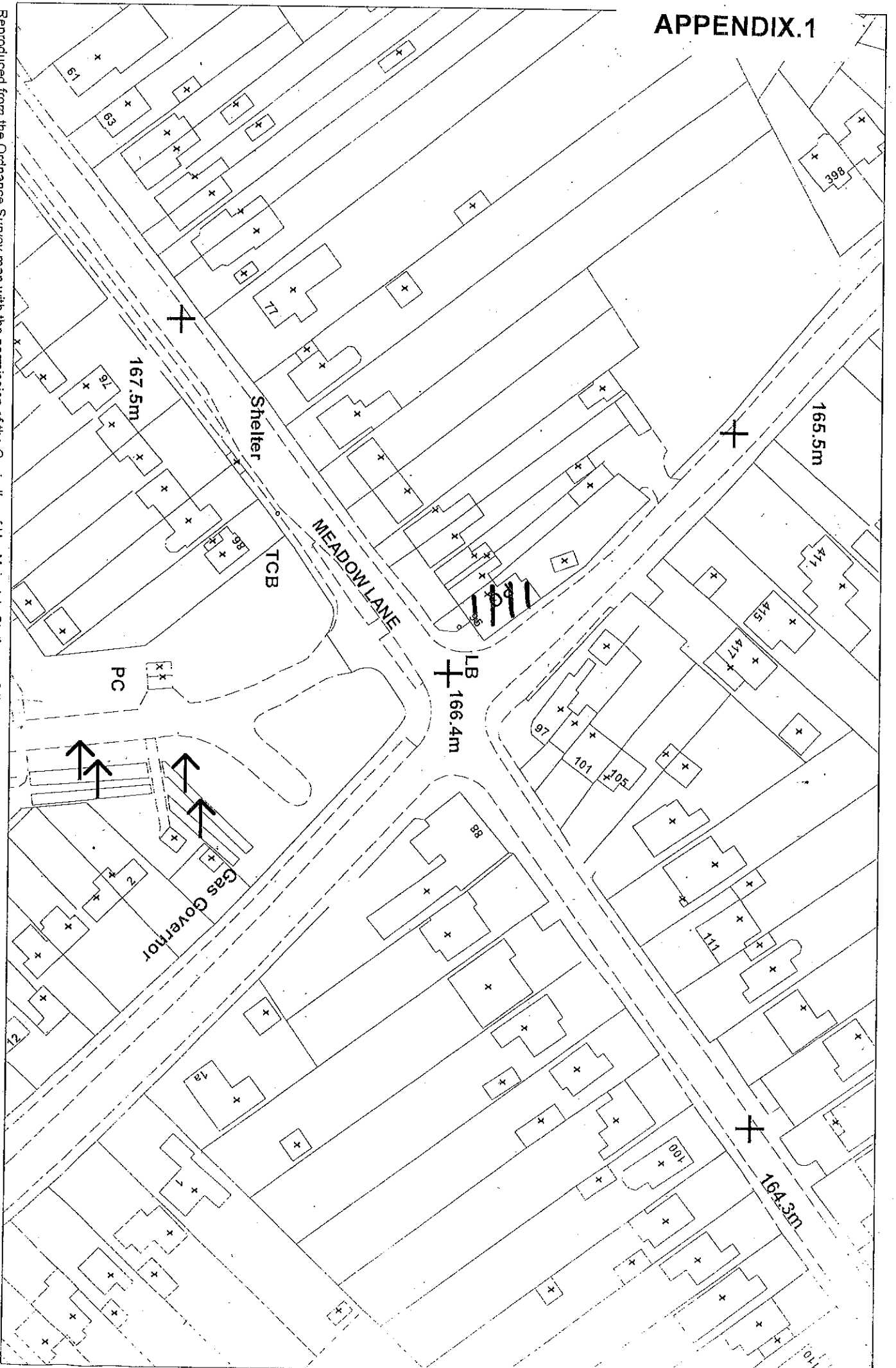

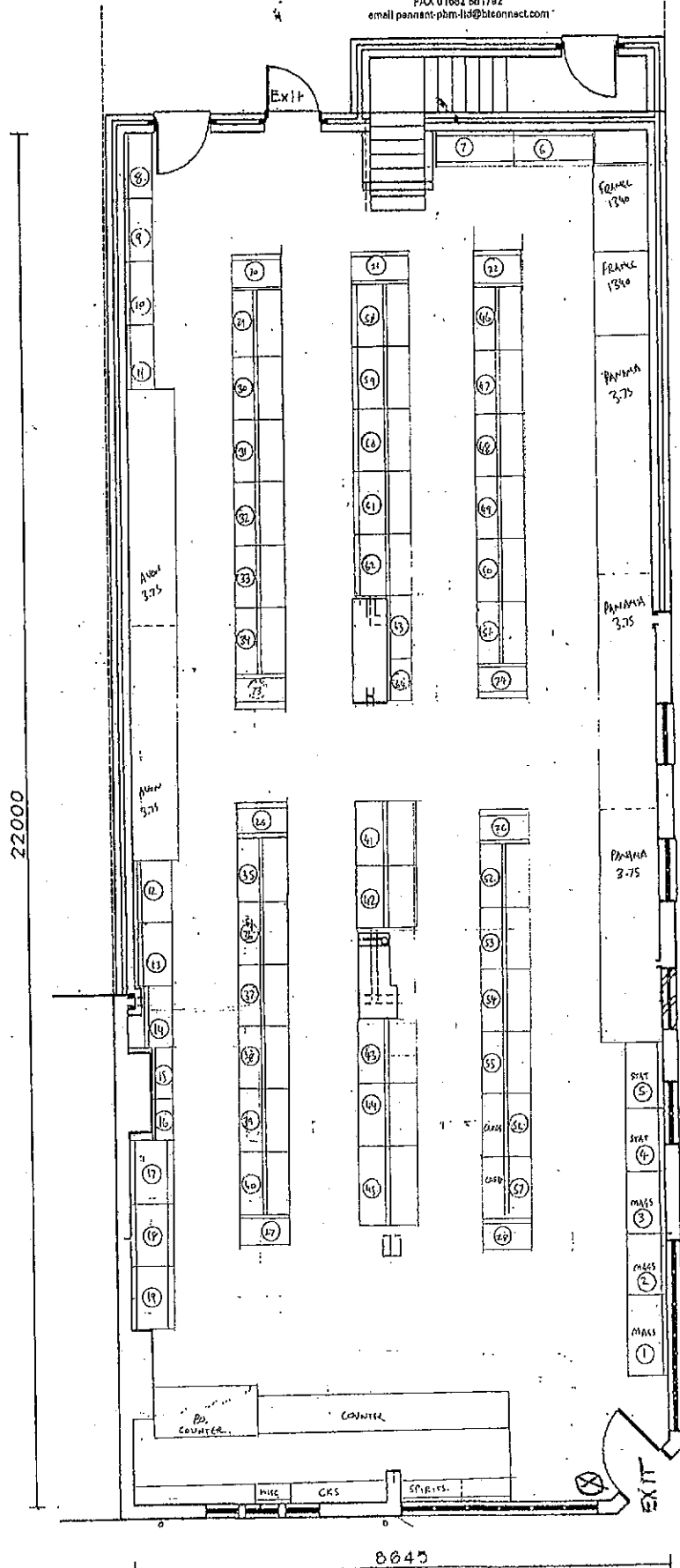

There are already two establishments at the Cross Roads who currently sell alcohol, and ~~add~~ think will only add to the already alcohol related problems, which are continuing to happen over a number of years since 2003.

The Council and Police have spent huge amounts of resources and time on trying to tackle this problem but to date it still continues here to untraged drinking and anti social behaviour related events from drinking in our local park.

Another major issue is the illegal parking problems at the Cross Roads. The post office does not have any parking so additional traffic visiting the premises will create an even greater danger to the Cross Roads. The Cross Roads is already a hot spot for the Council enforcement team.

Dear Mrs Ridgway

I would like to object to the application by the new owners of meadow lane post office to sell alcohol. I live just down the road, so being someone who could be affected by this decision there are a couple of points I would like to have my say on:

Firstly, there are already two shops that sell alcohol very close to the post office (I'm not sure of their times, but I know the post office has applied for a 5am-11pm licence which are longer hours). I think that anybody who buys alcohol at 5am in the morning has a problem, and the one hour later will just encourage more anti-social behavior and cause a nuisance to the locals as well as more parking around a busy junction (which needs a traffic warden to ticket people parking illegally by the way). If you have to pass it, you could at least restrict it to the same times the other shops can sell alcohol.

Secondly, the new owners have only been there for a matter of weeks and they are already trying to change things. The post office was fine the way it was before, this will just attract the wrong people into a shop which provides a important service to the locals who can't get into the main town to send parcels etc.

Dear Catherine Ridgway,

Cllr Michael Wyatt has informed us that the Meadow Lane Post office has submitted an application to sell alcohol on its premises seven days a week from 5.00 to 23.00 hours.

I strongly object that this application should be granted. Both the paper shop and the Coop sell alcohol the stock of which, between them, is extensive. A third alcohol outlet would be superfluous. I prefer shops to specialise and sell items that the others do not. Unfortunately this does not quite work and I thought the Coop selling newspapers was not necessary since we have a specialist shop for that.

We are living in an age where alcohol creates problems with those who abuse it and puts greater pressure on the Health Service. The government would like there to be less drinking and to curb the excesses of those who imbibe too much thereby causing trouble to themselves and their neighbourhood. I cannot see that alcohol at the Post Office is needed neither would it serve any positive use and might even damage the sales at the other two shops.

Since Alldays (now the Coop) extended their hours of opening some years ago, we have had a litter problem with people discarding their packages, wrappers and empty beer cans and bottles in hedges and peoples' gardens. Occasionally we get groups of younger people who nosily make their way home late at night. I, for one, do not wish these nuisances to increase.

I shall sign Michael Wyatt's petition but wanted to let you have a fuller explanation of my objections.

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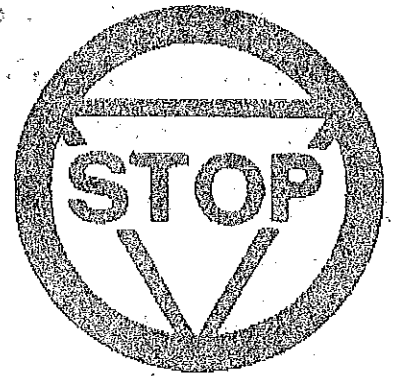




