Purpose of report	To determine an application for the grant of a premises licence in respect of premises, Meadow Lane Post Office, 95 Meadow Lane, Coalville, Leicestershire, LE67 4DN. This report outlines the application and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of Government guidance and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The premises currently operate as a Post Office and general convenience store.
- 1.2 A map showing the location of the premises is attached as **Appendix 1**.
- 1.3 An application for the grant of a premises licence was received from the applicant on 30 January 2013 via email and was accepted as an electronic application. A copy of the application is attached as **Appendix 2**.
- 1.4 The licensable activities applied for are detailed as follows:

Sale by retail of alcohol for consumption off the premises:

Monday to Sunday 05:00hrs until 23:00hrs

- 1.5 The applicant has specified steps they intend to take in order to promote the four licensing objectives:

General – All four licensing objectives:

- In the line with the government guidance the premises will manage the premises in line with all four of the licensing objective and all relevant legislation.

The prevention of crime and disorder:

- When the Designated Premises Supervisor is not at the premises another person shall be nominated by them to be the responsible person to manage the premises.
- CCTV will be installed at the premises and recordings will be kept for 28 days and made available to the responsible authorities upon any reasonable request in writing.

Public Safety:

- The licence holder is aware of and will ensure compliance with the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety Order) 2005.

The prevention of public nuisance:

- There are no issues relating to the prevention of public nuisance objective.

The protection of children from harm:

- Any person who looks or appears to be under the age of 21 shall be asked to provide ID to prove that they are over the age of 18.
- Only the UK photo driving licence, passport or government approved PASS cards will be accepted as proof of age.

- 1.6 Members will be aware that an identical application was submitted on 21 November 2012 and determined at a Licensing Sub Committee on 17 January 2013. Following a subsequent review of that decision a procedural irregularity was identified and a decision was made that it would be appropriate for a new application to be considered by a differently constituted Sub Committee.
- 1.7 Members are reminded that they must disregard the previous application and determination and consider this application **only** on the content of the Officers Report and attached Appendices and representations made to them at the Hearing.

2.0 REPRESENTATIONS

- 2.1 In respect of an application for the grant of a premises licence, the applicant is responsible for advertising the application by way of a notice in specified form at the premises for not less than 28 consecutive days and in a local newspaper. The applicant placed a notice in the Coalville Times on 8 February 2013 and officers have checked the premises and are satisfied that the correct notice has been displayed.
- 2.2 As the application was received electronically the Licensing Authority is required to serve a copy of the application on each of the responsible authorities, namely, the Police, Fire Authority, Trading Standards Department and the District Council's Health and Safety and Environmental Protection teams along with the Primary Care Trust, the Council's Planning Sections and the Licensing Authority. The Licensing Authority can confirm that all of the responsible authorities have been notified.
- 2.3 No representations have been received from any of the responsible authorities.
- 2.4 The applicant has agreed to various amendments to the conditions proposed by Leicestershire Trading Standards. The proposed conditions can be found at **Appendix 3**.
- 2.5 Any other person is able to make a representation within 28 days of the display of the notice of application to the Licensing Authority.
- 2.6 Forty one representations have been received on the grounds of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from

harm. Attached as **Appendix 4**. A breakdown of the representations can be made into the following subjects:

- Alcohol fuelled anti-social behaviour – 22 mentions
- Excess of premises supplying alcohol – 18 mentions
- Parking issues – 15 mentions
- Litter – 3 mentions
- Crime – 2 mentions
- More opportunities for under age drinking – 2 mentions
- Recent incident involving drunken male – 2 mentions
- Alcohol fuelled problems on local playing field – 1 mention
- Opening hours too long – 1 mention

2.7 A further 112 representations have been received in the form of a petition co-ordinated by Councillor Wyatt. Copies of the petition are attached as **Appendix 5**. The rear of the petition comprised an open letter to residents and included comments on the previous premises licence and the deliberations of the Licensing Sub Committee hearing held 17 January 2013 along with an invitation to complete the petition form. Members are reminded again that this is a new application and that the deliberations and decision of the previous Sub Committee are not relevant to this hearing. This application should only be considered on the basis of the information contained within the Officers Report and the representations made during the hearing.

2.8 A petition of 106 signatures in support of the application has also been received. A member has raised concerns that that petition may contain signatures of people who are aged under 18. In addition a number of the signatories consist only of a first name and a partial address.

2.9 The Licensing Act 2003 is silent as to how to deal with petitions either for or against an application and the Licensing Authority has determined that it will treat each petition in accordance with its adopted Petition Scheme. The petition scheme requires the name and address of each of the signatories must be on the petition. The Licensing Authority is of the view that those signatories should be disregarded when considering the petition.

2.10 Any signatory to the Petition that contains a full name and address has been considered as a valid representation and it is matter for Members to determine what weight, if any, they give to the representations contained within the petition either individually or as a whole.

2.11 The District Council does not have the facilities to check the age of the signatories to the petition and unless information to the contrary is forthcoming Members are advised to take the petition at face value attaching whatever weight they think appropriate to it. The petition can be found at **Appendix 6**.

3.0 STATUTORY GUIDANCE

3.1 In making its decision, the Sub Committee is obliged to have regard to Guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. All Licensing Committee members have been provided with a full copy of the guidance document. Officers consider that paragraphs 2.1 to 2.10, 2.18, 2.32 to 2.35, 8.5 to 8.13, 8.14 to 8.42, and 13.42 to 13.43 may have a bearing upon the application.

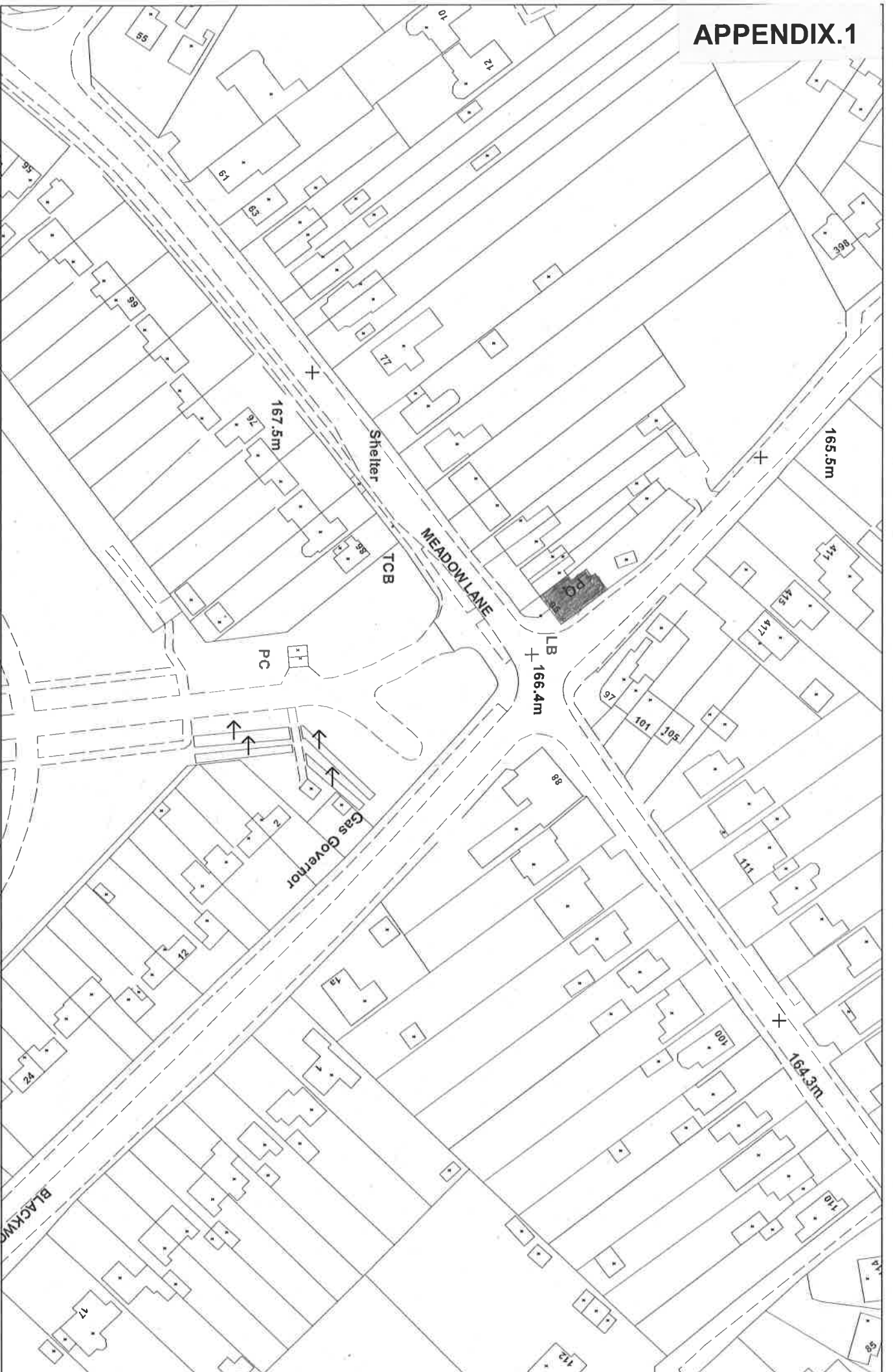
4.0 STATEMENT OF LICENSING POLICY

5.0 OBSERVATIONS

- 5.1 The Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, which are:
- the prevention of crime and disorder;
 - the prevention of public nuisance;
 - public safety;
 - the protection of children from harm.
- 5.2 The Committee may take such of the following steps, if any, as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
- a) Grant the application as requested.
 - b) Modify the conditions of the licence, by altering or omitting or adding to them.
 - c) Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 5.3 There is a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court against the decision of the Sub Committee by the applicant and persons who made relevant representations.

I, Vijay Odedra, wish to amend the following sections of the operating schedule of the above application as follows:

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder (amendment to item 2 of the application form)

2. CCTV shall be installed to specifications and locations agreed with the Leicestershire Police Crime Reduction Officer and maintained in accordance with the Information Commissioner's Code of Practice. The CCTV shall record at all times premises are open for any licensable activity. All images held are retained for 28 days and are to be made available on request by any of the responsible authorities.

The Protection of Children from Harm

1. The age determination policy 'Challenge 21' shall be operated on the premises at all times. All those working at the premises, paid or otherwise, shall require identification from customers purchasing alcohol who appear to be under the age dictated by the chosen policy and who are unknown to the person serving as being over 18 years of age. Acceptable proof of age will include a valid UK passport, UK photographic driving licence or a 'PASS' accredited proof of age card. No other form of identification shall be accepted unless agreed with the Licensing Authority or Leicestershire Constabulary. If the customer is unable to provide valid identification, then no sale shall be made. If it is known or believed that a customer intends to purchase alcohol on behalf of a person under the age of 18, then that sale will be refused.
2. Training will be provided for all staff, whether paid or unpaid, before they are allowed to sell alcohol and will include Challenge 21, conflict management and refusals records. The training will be documented. The Premises Licence Holder or Designated Premises Supervisor will check that the training has been understood. The training will be repeated at least every 6 months. Records of training will be provided to Responsible Authorities and the Licensing Authority on request.
3. Materials regarding Challenge 21 shall be displayed at the premises to inform customers of the operation of the scheme.
4. The Premises Licence Holder shall operate and maintain an up-to-date record of refused sales of alcohol, indicating the date, time, reason for refusal and person

refusing. This record shall be made available for inspection by any Responsible Authority and the Licensing Authority. The record will be reviewed at least once a month by the Designated Premises Supervisor or Premises Licence Holder. The person carrying out the review shall look for patterns and inconsistencies that may indicate that an individual is not following with the system or that additional support is required at certain times of the day. The reviewer shall sign and date the record once they have checked it and make a record of any action taken as a result

or

If a premises has an Electronic Point of Sale system with a programme which will determine age-restricted products then upon scanning an age-restricted product, the sales assistant shall evidence the individual's age by means of asking for identification. The system shall record all challenges made, which will be checked and monitored by the Designated Premise Supervisor monthly. The record shall be reviewed at least once a month by the Designated Premises Supervisor or premises licence holder. The person carrying out the review shall look for patterns and inconsistencies that may indicate that an individual is not complying with the system or that additional support is required at certain times of the day. The reviewer shall sign and date the record once checked and record any action taken as a result of the review. This information will be made available upon request to the Licensing Authority and any other Responsible Authority.

5. Signs shall be displayed inside and outside of the premises warning adults that it is an offence to buy alcohol on behalf of anyone under the age of 18.


1. It is difficult to comprehend how bad and rowdy behaviour will be controlled by the Post Office shop staff late at night. Both the Coop and Bargain Booze close before the time the Post office proposes to remain open which may suggest they do not want to invite trouble late at night.
2. There was a recent incident involving the police and paramedics on the ground outside 112 Meadow Lane when one man was paralytically drunk between 6.30pm and 7.00pm. Although not frequent, it is not unknown for people to sit on the wall by the stream and consume alcohol from cans and bottles. The spot is isolated and out of view from the main road. Such incidents could become more frequent with such early and late opening hours, especially in warmer weather.
2. Litter both in the streets and private gardens increased when both the Coop and Bargain Booze extended their hours into the evening. Additional problems of this nature will not be welcome due to yet another outlets and a further extension of opening hours.

GENERAL.

We object that the Licensing Act does not take into consideration the number of alcohol serving outlets and the position of the retail units in consideration with the road system. Both seem to be common sense objections.

When the government and the medial profession are concerned about the increasing amount of alcohol abuse and its cost to personal health and the nation's purse, it seems unwise to permit yet another outlet which plans to operate for so many hours in the day. It hardly represents joined up thinking

Many of you have already signed my petition against the application, and a number of you have also sent in objections which I am most grateful.

A few weeks ago the Council considered the application. Unfortunately the Labour and Tory Councillors sitting on the panel decided to allow the license, even though there was sufficient evidence and support from the local community to refuse this application.

One of the main reasons they gave for allowing the application was the failure by the local Police to send any representation. After the meeting I contacted the Police who informed me that they had NOT been consulted or asked for any representation on this issue.

Clearly due to this information coming to light I contacted the Chief Executive of the Council asking for a full investigation. The Council admitted that they had failed to follow the procedures set out when deciding if to grant a license. 

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

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
