1.2.3 Queen’s Platinum Jubilee plan – CEO briefing note (5 May 2022)

In celebration of the Queen’s Platinum Jubilee events were delivered in Coalville on Saturday 4 and Sunday 5 June in Coalville Park. In advance of the Jubilee extended weekend bunting and flags were installed in Coalville, Memorial Clock Tower and Stenson House were lit red, white and blue, shops and businesses participated in a best dressed shop window competition and 70 original artworks were installed in the town centre in celebration of 70 years of service of Queen Elizabeth II.

a) Saturday 4 June – 6pm – 9.30pm – the sun shone and an evening of live entertainment on the main stage from Silcone taxis (soft rock, funk music) and Steve King Big Band (1940’s style) was delivered, including street performers, catering stalls and a bar.

b) Sunday 5 June – 12noon – 5.30pm – with a very wet start to the day (and a number of other events being cancelled) it was decided that ‘rain would not stop play’ in Coalville. An afternoon of live entertainment was delivered including: Hey Beatles, Queen II, Leicestershire Co op band, Baby big top circus shows, climbing wall, fair rides, craft stalls and catering. Despite a number of our stallholders and caterers cancelling on the day we were still able to deliver the event which was well attended, supported and appreciated by local people.

Media Coverage

Ahead of the event and during the event, there was a good amount of media interest to promote what was taking place in Coalville to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

Radio

There were three interviews covering the competitions, events and tree planting with Fosse 107 and BBC Radio Leicester.



Print

The Coalville Times and Leicester Mercury both printed articles about the competitions and events in Coalville.



Online

The events and competitions were also promoted online thanks to Staffordshire Live, Nub News and Leicestershire Live.

Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebration, Coalville Park
From 6pm until 9.30pm, with soul, funk and rock 'n' roll four-piece, The Silicone Taxis and jazz music from The Steve King Big Band.
Family entertainment includes Baby Big Top Circus, a climbing wall plus skate and scooter and graffiti workshops.

In total, we issued 6 press releases which resulted in 15 pieces of coverage with three on radio, 5 in print and 7 online.

Evaluation

The positive comments far outweighed any negative comments we had which were mostly in relation to the weather or things that were out of our control. Based on the comments, there are things we could look to do for future events, like offering free parking in our car parks. We could also think about sharing an itinerary so people can see what time the acts are on although these queries may have been a result of the weather. In future events, if the weather forecast is for rain, we could share a post to be clear that the event is still going ahead. With regards to the comments about the photos of the Best Dressed Window displays, it was explained that the photos were taken on a particularly sunny day when there was more glare, and close to the road which made it difficult. The aim of the competition was for people to vote for their favourites whilst they were in the town centre and not rely on social media to choose. The comment about the rides was also addressed in a post to explain to visitors that most of the event was free including the climbing wall, graffiti workshop, Baby Big Top Circus and other activities – the rides and inflatables were the only things that required a charge.
