Adoption of Zero Carbon Roadmap and Action Plan		
Decision Details		
The Portfolio Holder for Community Services approved the recommendations set out in the report following consultation with the Strategic Director/Head of Community Services:		
 The Zero Carbon Roadmap and Action Plan (Annex A, B and C). The allocation of a resource for a Climate Change Officer to lead on the Carbon Reduction Roadmap, develop relevant projects/funding bids and coordinate the work programme for both the council's operations and the district as a whole (para 12.1) The allocation of a resource to continue the food waste collection trial in Measham and a resource for a second pilot in Coalville (para 13.2). 		
As set out in the report each action will require a detailed business case to assess the affordability and deliverability of a potential project and the council will need to consider the revenue and capital funding requirement of each action on a case by case basis, with decisions referred back to Cabinet as required.		
Reason for Decision		
The decision provides the framework and route map for the Council achieve its aim of achieving carbon neutrality from its own operations by 2030. The Action Plan and decisions set out in the report are the first steps in delivering on the declaration made by North West Leicestershire District Council at its Full Council meeting in June 2019.

Decision Title

Support to the Council's Leisure Operator in light of the Coronavirus Situation

Decision Details

The decision approves an emergency financial support package for Everyone Active to ensure that their staff remain employed and that our leisure partner remains operational in the current Covid 19 crisis.

The Cabinet Member for Community Services approved the recommendations following consultation with the Strategic Director/Head of Community Services set out in the report:

- 1. Approve the financial support package as set out in paragraph 3 of the report.
- 2. Authorise the Head of Community Services in consultation with the S151 officer to implement the support package following a monthly review.
- 3. Authorise the Director of Place to vary the contract with Everyone Active to enable the financial support package to be provided.

The report was considered and the consequences of not supporting our leisure partner as set out in paragraph 1.5 in that if "Everyone Active does fail as a business then there will be considerable financial ramifications to the council. An alternative leisure partner would need to be procured at a significant cost or the service would have to be delivered in-house with all staff requiring a TUPE transfer back to the council. In addition, the building of the new Coalville Leisure Centre may be put in jeopardy or, at best, it will be significantly delayed."

Reason for Decision

The decision ensures that the employees, who transferred from the council on 1st May 2019, will continue to be paid during the Corona Virus. Measures have been put in place to ensure that through the government's Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme Everyone Active will make a claim for 80% of their salary costs which if successful will be reimbursed to the Council.

The Labour Group sought the following assurances on the report which were considered as part of the decision and agreed as correct and covered by the decision and agreements that will be put in place.

- The 80% salary payment from Government will be backdated to the start of the furlough period.
- Claims for this money from an employer are not invalidated by voluntary work being carried out for the employer's client.
- That the redirection of EA staff on furlough is genuinely on a voluntary basis and no sanctions will be made against those workers choosing to opt out, for whatever reason.
- Where claims from the Government are met, the Council are able to reclaim the 20% of salary overpaid to the contractor.
- That the Council will take full responsibility for staff working on a voluntary basis, with respect to training, health & safety, injury / sickness, protective work gear and insurance.
- The Council and / or the Leisure Operator carry out due diligence to ensure correct payments for National Insurance and pension contributions are made.

The Cabinet Member for Community Services consulted the Cabinet Member for Finance as part of making the decision.

The Leader of the Council approved the recommendations set out in the report following consultation with the Strategic Director:

- 1. APPROVES TO ALLOCATE UP TO £55,000 FUNDING FROM EXISTING BUSINESS FOCUS GROWTH PLAN EARMARKED RESERVE BUDGETS AND DELEGATE AUTHORITY TO SPEND TO THE DIRECTOR OF PLACE TO FURTHER DEVELOP A FULL BUSINESS CASE FOR SUBMISSION TO FUTURE HIGH STREETS FUND
- 2. APPROVES THE ACCEPTANCE OF A GRANT OF UP TO £100,000 FROM THE LEICESTER AND LEICESTERSHIRE BUSINESS RATE POOL FUNDING TO FURTHER THE REGENERATION PROJECTS IDENTIFIED THROUGH THE FUTURE HIGH STREET FUND, AND TO DELEGATE EXPENDITURE OF THE GRANT TO THE STRATEGIC DIRECTOR OF PLACE
- 3. APPROVES THE ACCEPTANCE OF AGRANT OF UP TO £30,000 FROM THE LEICESTER AND LEICESTERSHIRE BUSINESS RATE POOL FUNDING TO ENHANCE CYCLING AND PEDESTRIAN LINKS IN COALVILLE TOWN CENTRE, AND TO DELEGATE EXPENDITURE OF THE GRANT TO THE STRATEGIC DIRECTOR OF PLACE
- 4. APPROVES THE COMMISSIONING OF AN OPTIONS STUDY TO RELOCATE THE DISTRICT COUNCIL'S DEPOT ON LINDEN WAY
- 5. APPROVES THE EXPENDITURE OF £16,000 FROM THE EXISTING BUSINESS FOCUS
 GROWTH PLAN EARMARKED RESERVE TO FUND THE COMMISSIONING OF AN OPTIONS
 STUDY REFERRED TO IN RECOMMENDATION 4 ABOVE

Cabinet in September 2019 delegated authority to the Strategic Director to award a contract for up to £150,000 for the development of the full business which had been funded through grant direct from FHSF. Additional work required to finalize the business required as set out in the report (paragraph 2) was discussed to ensure the Council maximises the opportunity of making a successful bid and enables further specialist technical input.

Additional grants have been sought by the Council to support regeneration in Coalville including capacity for delivery after submission of the business case and developing further cycling and pedestrian links. These are set out in paragraph 3 and 4 of the report.

As part of the FHSF submission work is ongoing to develop a proposal to support regeneration on Wolsey Road and Baker Street. Work is considering the option for the potential relocation of the Linden way depot and this is set out in paragraph 5 of the report.

Reason for Decision

To progress the Future High Streets Fund Work.

RENT POLICY OPTIONS IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19		
Decision Details		
The Portfolio Holder for Housing, Property and Customer Services made this decision after considering the above report and taking advice from the Head of Housing. Councillor Sean Sheahan advised that he had no comments on the proposal.

DELEGATE AUTHOURITY TO THE STRATEGIC DIRECTOR IN CONSULTATION WITH THE HOUSING AND CUSTOMER SERVICES, AND CORPORATE PORTFOLIOHOLDERS, AND THE SECTION 151 OFFICER, TO EXTEND THIS POLICY BEYOND 3 MONTHS FOLLOWING COMPLETION OF A REVIEW OF ITS EFFECTIVENESS. AGREE THAT IF THIS POLICY IS NOT EXTENDED USING THE DELEGATED AUTHOURITY AT 2, THE PREVIOUS POLICIES WITH RESPECT TO RENTS WILL BECOME EFFECTIVE AGAIN AFTER A PERIOD OF 6 MONTHS FROM THIS DECISION.
