# 1.0 Background

- 1.1 The premises are a public house located at 65 Church Street, Donisthorpe, Swadlincote, Derbyshire, DE12 7PX and currently hold a premises licence issued under the Licensing Act 2003. A copy of the premises licence is attached as **appendix 1.**
- 1.2 A map showing the location of the premises is attached as **appendix 2.**
- 1.3 An application for the variation of premises licence was received by Mr Peter Riley and Mr Paul Aldred on 11 June 2014. A copy of the application is attached as **appendix 3**.
- 1.4 The details of the variation application are as follows:
  - The extension of the licensable area to include a new beer garden and children's play area in the paddock adjacent to the pub car park.
  - Plays and Films (Indoors and Outdoors)

Monday to Thursday – 10:00hrs until 00:01hrs Friday and Saturday – 10:00hrs until 01:00hrs Sunday – 11:00hrs until 00:01hrs

Indoor Sporting Events

Monday to Sunday - 11:00hrs until 00:01hrs

Boxing or Wrestling entertainments (Indoors and Outdoors)

Monday to Sunday – 11:00hrs until 00:01hrs

 Live Music, Recorded Music, Performance of dance, Anything of a similar description (Indoors and Outdoors)

Monday to Thursday – 11:00hrs until 00:01hrs Friday and Saturday – 11:00hrs until 01:00hrs Sunday – 11:00hrs until 00:01hrs

## Late Night Refreshment

- To remove condition 6 of Annex 2 No children will be allowed on the premises after 21:00hrs.
- 1.5 The applicant has specified steps they intend to take in order to promote the four licensing objectives:

## General - All four licensing objectives:

- CCTV cameras will be installed in all areas of the premises
- Fire fighting equipment will be available
- Age awareness
- Vigilant of drugs and knives

# The prevention of crime and disorder:

- CCTV cameras
- Age awareness
- Drug and weapon awareness

## Public safety:

- Fire fighting equipment will be available
- PAT testing
- Visual maintenance of up keep and acted upon pest control

## The prevention of public nuisance:

- No permanent speakers outside
- Customers refused alcohol if appear drunk and requested to leave premises quietly and to consider residents in all aspects e.g. litter, nuisance and have respect for the surroundings.

### The protection of children from harm:

- CCTV camera's
- Childproof locks
- Children accompanied by a responsible adult
- No children on premises after 22:00hrs
- Play area will be drink, food and pet free

# 2.0 Representations

- 2.1 In respect of an application to vary the premises licence, the applicant is responsible for advertising the application by way of a notice in specified form at the premises for not less than 28 consecutive days and in a local newspaper. The applicant placed a notice in the Leicester Mercury on 12 June 2014 and Officers are satisfied that the correct notices have been displayed at the premises. Details of the application were also posted onto the Council website on 9 June 2014.
- 2.2 No representations have been received from any of the responsible authorities.
- 2.3 Any other person is able to make representations within 28 days of display of the notice of application to the Licensing Authority.
- 2.4 One representation has been received from a local resident based on the prevention of public nuisance. A copy of the representation is attached as **appendix 4.**

## 3.0 Statutory Guidance

3.1 In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is obliged to have regard to Guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. All Licensing Committee members have been provided with a full copy of the guidance document. Officers consider that paragraphs 1.1 to 1.5, 1.16, 1.17, 2.1 to 2.34, 8.42, 8.54, 8.72 to 8.75, 9.1 to 9.11 may have a bearing upon the application.

# 4.0 Statement of Licensing Policy

4.1 The Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to its own Statement of Licensing Policy. Officers consider that paragraphs 2.3, 2.4, 2.5, 6.1 to 6.4, 13, may have a bearing upon the application.

### 5.0 Observations

- 5.1 The Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, which are:
  - the prevention of crime and disorder;
  - public safety;
  - the prevention of public nuisance;
  - the protection of children from harm.
- 5.2 The Committee may take such of the following steps, if any, as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
  - a) Grant the application as requested.
  - b) Modify the conditions of the licence, by altering or omitting or adding to them.
  - c) Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 5.3 There is a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court against the decision of the Sub-Committee by the applicant and persons who made relevant representations.

### Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1 No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence;
- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory conditions coming into force from 6<sup>th</sup> April 2010:

- (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

 (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
  - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
  - 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.


Mandatory conditions coming into force from 1<sup>st</sup> October 2010:

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that -
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

### Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- The licence holders and their employees will remain aware of the licensing objectives and ensure that they are reflected in the way the premises are run.
- 2 Trained staff will be vigilant in watching for any criminal activity including the carrying of knives and the use of drugs.
- 3 Fire fighting equipment will be installed and regularly tested with electrical installations.
- The licence holders will take steps to ensure that customers behave within the premises and when leaving it in endeavour to keep noise, nuisance and litter to a minimum. Notices will be put up in the premises and in the car park to advise customers to leave quietly and with due consideration for local residents.
- Children will only be allowed onto the premises when accompanied by a responsible adult. Bar staff will be instructed in age-identification procedures and the production of appropriate evidence of age.
- 6 No children will be allowed on the premises after 21:00 hours.



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

Dear Mr Eyre,

We are writing to you to voice our objection to the proposed variation in the licence for the Halfway House Public House in Donisthorpe. We feel the proposed variation to include the beer garden and play area will impact adversely on our ability to have an acceptable quality of life which is a breach of the human rights act 1998 article 1 and 8 which says,

Every person has the right to respect for his home and private and family life and that we are entitled to peaceful enjoyment of our possessions.

This forms part of your Statement of Licencing Policy 2014-2019.

Under the Public Nuisance licencing objective contained in this same policy it states that the needs of businesses have to be balanced against the needs of the residence to have an acceptable quality of life. We feel that as the landlord of the pub appears unable to be fair in this regard as documentation we have sent you demonstrates, so we are looking to you to safeguard our interests in this matter as it is a legal requirement for you to do.

Our concerns are as follows,

A 10 meter buffer zone was included as a condition of planning approval ref 14/00102/FUL which should be 'free from use and development and be implemented along the north western and south western boundaries.' We would like to make sure this area won't be included in the licence variation as this may lead to confusion over where people are allowed to go while drinking. The report by the planning officer states it should be a 'no go area and left only as a wildlife corridor' although we are aware this now appears to be being developed by the landlord contrary to the planning conditions. We are aware that an acoustic fence has been included in this scheme in order to get it through planning but without any details of its height and the type of fencing we remain unconvinced this alone will mitigate the disruption to us sufficiently to not affect our enjoyment of our home.

We are also worried that if no limit is placed on the number of patrons/tables in the beer garden there is huge potential for public nuisance. This area could more than double the number of customers using the pub at any one time and increase greatly the amount of noise and disruption, at

the moment there are only four tables at the front of the pub. In addition to this the pub hasn't altered its facilities to accommodate this increase for example there are still only two toilets. This could potentially lead to people urinating outside. We have been notified that the landlord is planning to step away from the day to day running of the pub once this process is completed leaving a young and very inexperienced team to oversee this potentially difficult transition and increase in business.

We are aware that other pubs in the area have restricted the opening hours for their outside areas to mitigate noise disruption for local residents for example in Ashby De La Zouch many of the pubs close their beer gardens / outside spaces at 10.00 / 10.30. As this is a less urban area the potential for noise carrying is far greater especially at night, we hope this same policy of different operating hours will be adopted in this case.

In addition to this we also have concerns about potential littering, smoke and light pollution and trust that the impact of all these will be considered during this process.

We would welcome the opportunity for you to visit our home so we can demonstrate the close proximity of the beer garden to our property and that of the new proposed dwelling, and so we can further discuss our concerns. Please email me at any time
