Purpose of report	To consider an objection notice made by the Chief Officer of Police in response to a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) in respect of the premises trading as The West End Club located at 188 Ashby Road, Coalville, Leicestershire, LE67 3LB. This report outlines the TEN and summarises the representation received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of Government guidance and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

1.0 Background

- 1.1 The premises are a public house/club located at 188 Ashby Road, Coalville, LE67 3LB and currently hold a premises licence issued under the Licensing Act 2003. A copy of the premises licence is attached as **appendix 1.**
- 1.2 On 22 June 2017, a temporary event notice was received from Amanda Brooks regarding the intended use of the premises for the provision of regulated entertainment, and the sale by retail of alcohol on the premises from 18.00hrs on 4 November 2017, to 01.00hrs the following morning of 5 November 2017. A copy of the temporary event notice is attached as **appendix 2.**
- 1.3 A map showing the location of the premises is attached as **appendix 3.**
- 1.4 A permitted temporary activity is a licensable activity that is carried out in accordance with a temporary event notice under Section 100 and in compliance with the provisions of Part 5 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.5 The temporary event notice is subject to various restrictions and limits. Where the requirements for obtaining a temporary event notice cannot be met, the licensable activity can only be authorised by way of a premises licence.
- 1.6 Officers are satisfied that the temporary event notices have been properly served and the criteria in respect of temporary event notices have been met.

2.0 Representations

2.1 In respect of a temporary event notice (TEN), the notice giver is responsible for submitting a copy of the notice to the Chief Officer of Police and the Environmental Health Section no later than 10 working days before the day on which the event begins or 5 working days before the event if a late application. However if the TEN is received by the Licensing Authority electronically, the Licensing Authority must serve the TEN upon Chief Officer of Police and the Environmental Health Section. If the Chief Officer of Police or Environmental Health Section is satisfied that allowing the premises to be used in accordance with the notice would undermine any of the licensing objectives, he must give a notice to the Licensing Authority and premises licence user detailing the reasons for the decision.

- 2.2 As the TEN was received by the Licensing Authority electronically, a copy of the TEN was emailed on 22 June 2017 to the Chief Officer of Police as required. An objection notice was then received from the Police on 27 June 2017 on the grounds of prevention of crime and disorder, prevention of public nuisance and public safety. The objection notice was also served upon the TEN giver by the Police. A copy of the objection notice is attached as **appendix 4.**
- 2.3 A copy of the TEN was also emailed on 22 June 2017 to the Environmental Health Section. No representation has been received.

3.0 Statutory Guidance

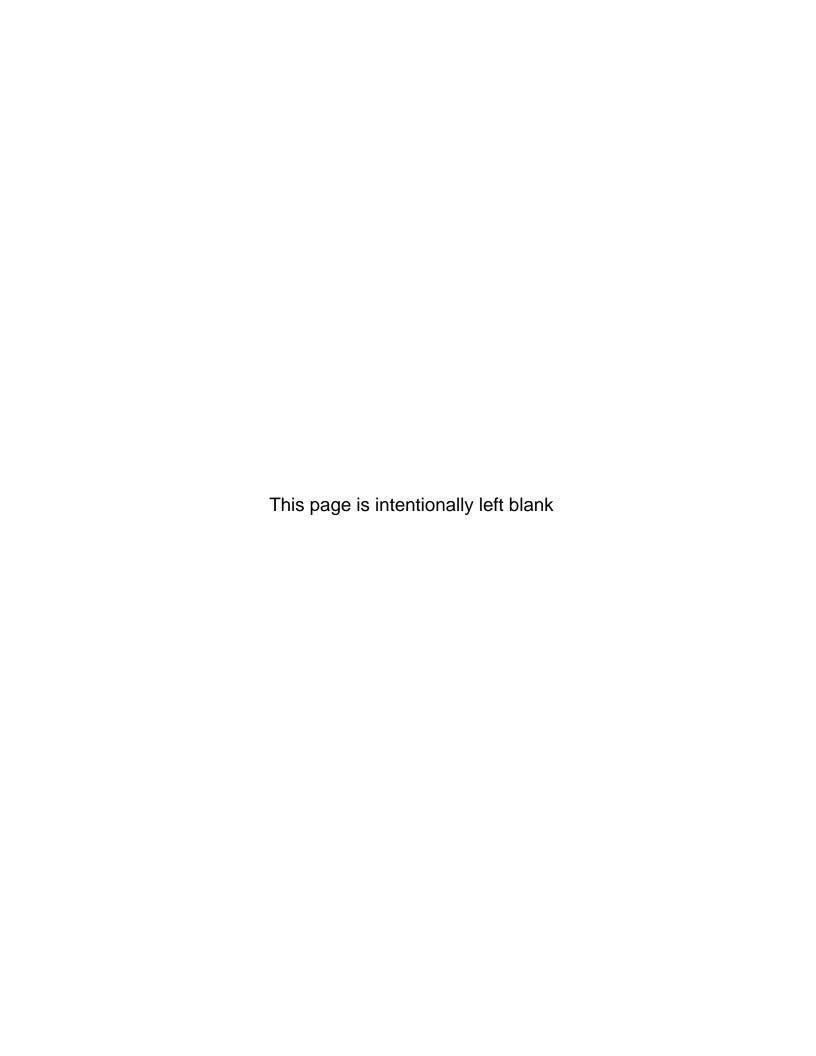
3.1 In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is obliged to have regard to Guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. All Licensing Committee members have been provided with a full copy of the guidance document. Officers consider that paragraphs 2.1 to 2.6, 2.7 to 2.9, 2.15 to 2.21, 7.1 to 7.6, 7.8 to 7.11, 7.14, and 7.23 to 7.39 may have a bearing upon the TEN.

4.0 Statement of Licensing Policy

4.1 The Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to its own Statement of Licensing Policy. Officers consider that section 18 may have a bearing upon the TEN.

5.0 Observations

- 5.1 The Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives which are;
 - The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - The prevention of public nuisance;
 - Public safety
 - The protection of children from harm.
- 5.2 If the TEN is in connection with licensable activities at a licensed premises, the Licensing authority may also impose one or more of the existing licence conditions of the TEN (insofar as such conditions are not inconsistent with the event) if it considers that it is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 5.3 If having regard to the objection notice, the Licensing Authority is satisfied that it is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives it must give a counter notice detailing the reasons for the decision to the premises user in which case the event cannot proceed.
- 5.4 If the Licensing Authority determines not to give a counter notice, it must give the notice of its decision to the premises user and the Police. The decision whether to issue a counter notice or not must be made and notices issued at least 24 hours before the event is due to begin.
- 5.5 There is a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court against the decision of the Sub-Committee by the premises user if a Counter Notice is issued, or by the chief officer of police if no Counter Notice is issued. Notwithstanding this, no appeal may be brought later than 5 working days before the day on which the temporary event begins.

Late Night Refreshment:

Sunday to Saturday – 23.00hrs to 02.00hrs

From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours the following day.

When the premises are open or have remained open for the purpose of televised broadcasts such as Olympics, international sporting events eg, tennis, cricket, golf, rugby, hockey, boxing, not in themselves regulated entertainment.

The premises may open for outside the standard hours if the licensable activity is being promoted as a marathon or sponsored fund raising/charity type event.

Indoor sporting events:

Sunday to Saturday – 10.00hrs to 02.00hrs

From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours the following day

The premises may open for licensable activities for the purposes of indoor games such as pool, snooker, boules, bowling, and traditional pub sporting activities if the manner of their promotion by way of competition or tournaments makes than liable to be classified as indoor sporting events.

The premises may open for outside the standard hours if the licensable activity is being promoted as a marathon or sponsored fund raising/charity type event.

Performance of live music:

Sunday to Saturday – 10.00hrs to 02.00hrs

From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours the following day

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence;
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory condition coming into force from 28th May 2014:

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol:
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that subparagraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Mandatory condition coming into force from 1st October 2014:


- 1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

- 4. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. For the purposes of avoiding noise nuisance doors and windows of the premises will be kept closed except for access and egress from the premises when amplified music is being played.
- 2. Regular checks shall be made by the management during events at the premises to ensure that the operation of premises activities does not cause a nuisance to the surrounding community.
- 3. The licensee will ensure that CCTV is installed following advice from the Leicestershire Constabulary Crime Reduction Officer and suitably maintained and that the licensee understands that the number and positioning of cameras is for one camera suitable positioned to monitor persons entering and leaving the premises.

I write in my capacity as the Licensing Manager for the Leicestershire Police on the authority delegated to me by the Chief Constable.

The police are asking the committee to refuse this application as we believe it is failing to support the three licensing objectives above.

The application is for a Temporary Event Notice at a licensed premises.

The event to be held is a boxing match, which there is no detail of:

- 1. The rules that will be adhered to (British Boxing Board of Control, Guidelines, covering Knockdowns, bare knuckle or gloved, time of bouts, duration...)
- 2. Details of boxers
- 3. Details of referee
- 4. Full safety policy
- 5. Medical service provisions
- 6. Details of expected crowd
- 7. Security provisions
- 8. Conditions of entry

Nationally police are concerned regarding boxing events, due to the type of crowd, their expectations; at a recent event in Leeds, serious disorder broke out, with the crowd throwing water into the ring, which escalated into a large scale fight.

50-60 people were involved, hand to hand fighting broke out, with chairs, beer and other furniture being thrown. A female supporter was knocked out, being punched to the face. The incident made local news.

In addition, amateur fights are a high risk sporting event, with deaths in the ring not uncommon. As recent as March this year, at a boxing event in Derbyshire, a 17 year old, unfortunately died in the ring.

The police are also concerned regarding the promoter. I am informed this is a: Stevie Gold, with all contact via Facebook, but no further details has been provided.
