**Please summarise your concerns about this application:**

I write in my capacity as the Licensing Manager for the Leicestershire Police on the authority delegated to me by the Chief Constable.

These are three applications to vary the sale of late night refreshments (no alcohol) with an increase of 2 hours to 2 am, on 21<sup>st</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> December 2016. An increase of 1.5 hours from 1am until 4 a.m. on 17<sup>th</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup>, 30<sup>th</sup>, 31<sup>st</sup> and 1<sup>st</sup> January 2017.

These premises are situated on Market Street which is within the cumulative impact area as adopted by the Licensing Authority.

The area is very popular due to the bars and clubs and sees an increase in footfall as the weekend approaches.

The premises have recently come to the attention of the police with evidence of breaches of their current licence.

The premises licence stipulates that orders for food and drink shall cease at 02.15 hours and doors to the premises will be closed at this time.

It also has a further condition that 1 SIA authorised door staff will be employed between 23.00 and the terminal hour.

On the 12<sup>th</sup> November police witnessed sales at 02.40 hours and no door staff present.

13<sup>th</sup> November police visited the premises at 02.30 and although staff were stopping people entering, there were still customers inside.

20<sup>th</sup> November police visited the premises at 02.30, where customers were queuing to enter the premises. Although the PLH was spoken to, when police returned 10 minutes later sales were continuing.

On the 9<sup>th</sup> December 2016 a meeting was held with the PLH, Frida Hussain, concerning the unlicensed activities with Sergeant Barlow.

During the meeting the breaches were explained and not contested by the PLH.

The PLH agreed to uphold the current Licence conditions and a further meeting was proposed in 3 months to consider a proposed application to increase the premises hours.
