**LICENSING ACT 2003 - LATE TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE (TENS)
Favourite Chicken and Pizza, 59 Market Street, Ashby De La Zouch, Leics.**

I write further to the late temporary event notice submitted by you for an event at the above named premises on 21st to 25th December 2016.

In respect of the late temporary event notice, the Licensing Authority has received an objection notice from Leicestershire Police relating to the crime and disorder, public safety, public nuisance and protection of children from harm licensing objectives. As an objection has been received the event must not go ahead. Please note that where a late TEN has received objections, there is no scope for a hearing.

Please note that the Licensing Act 2003 does not make provision for you to appeal against this counter notice.

Under section 136 of the Licensing Act 2003, a person commits an offence if he carries on a licensable activity on or from any premises otherwise than under and in accordance with an authorisation; or if he knowingly allows a licensable activity to be so carried on. A person convicted of such an offence is liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding £20,000, or to both.

Counter Notice (Late Temporary Event Notice) – Permitted Temporary Activities

On 9th December 2016 the licensing authority received from you, Mr Fida Hussain a late temporary event notice (“the notice”) in respect of proposed temporary licensable activities due to take place on 21st to 25th December 2016 at Favourite Chicken and Pizza, 59 Market Street, Ashby De La Zouch, Leics. The licensing authority has received an objection under section 104(2) of the Licensing Act 2003 (“the Act”).
