Explanation of police data used:-

The Police Inn Webb

This computer system is a data base recording all visits and interactions between the police and the premises. This system is a data base used by the licensing dpt and is reliant on officers inputting information. This will not reflect all incidents recorded, but will give a good overall picture of the types of incidents coming to police attention. You will see the word Inn webb below to denote these records.

Not all interactions have been listed with incidents below. This will be because there were no issues or Police did not input data onto Inn webb.

At the start of the bundle all Inn Webb reports have been listed to show transparency. Again not all of those incidents will be negative.

Total Inn Webb reports:-

2012 Only 4 records.

Mr Garbett took over the running of the premises start of 2013.

2013- 19 visits/interactions-

2014-16 visits/interactions –(increase since application)

Storm incidents

Are a reflection of calls to police from public/CCTV operators/Police and are used to manage responses to incidents. There may be duplicate reports from various sources to one incident, eg from different members of public reporting the same incident. These incidents are created to manage an incident and send a resource if required/available.

Crime reports

Are created when an allegation or evidence suggests a criminal offence is committed. This is used to manage an ongoing investigation to a case.

A crime may or may not have been committed. If a crime is identified, then there may be a crime report number.

Sentinel data

Finally you will see mention of the word Sentinel. This is yet another data base, used to record and manage anti social behaviour.

To conclude

I have submitted the incidents in date order.

With each date you will then see Inn Webb data/ Storm incidents/CIS crime reports/any relevant statements and possibly Sentinel records, relevant to that incident on that date. This has been done to be transparent and ensure as full as picture as possible is given for any one incident.

So there will be a variation in the types of reports submitted. This will be dependant on how many people reported, the type of police response and whether there was a crime, Anti social behaviour, both or neither.

Finally in addition to the cases referred to in the initial application, you will note details of contacts in between incident dates, which are relevant. There will be details of issues between incidents. These are added for context, for example not being able to collect CCTV.

Since the application, further incidents have occurred which are also listed in the bundle.

Incident 734 26/04/2014 relates to the drunken male outside The Three Crowns, Market Place, Whitwick.

At 1.25am a middle aged male leaves the pub with a female. The male was heavily intoxicated, he was unsteady on his feet and being assisted to walk by the female. The male then proceeded to start pulling at branches on a tree just down from the pub, his behaviour was to the degree that I went and advised him.

At 1.35am a group of 5 – 6 people leave the pub, most of the group were clearly intoxicated and walking in the road. A male and female split from the group and walked along Hall Lane, the male was quite aggressive towards the female to the degree that I again had to intervene. The male was heavily in drink, the female with him was his sister. The male fell over in the street and his behaviour was such that he was advised if he carried on he would be arrested. His father attended shortly after this to take the male home.

Between 1.55am and 2.12am when the pub closed there was an increase in the number of people leaving, I could hear people talking very loud, some shouting and some swearing. A group of people remained outside the pub until 2.20am.

I have had a funny week regarding the Three Crowns – first I had some serious complaints that I was going to bring to your attention on Thursday only to find that the Council had already been in touch and that you had resigned with effect from today. I now find that you have changed your mind and are carrying on.

As DPS you must be exercising some control over the premises even if you are not actually there. You also remain answerable for any issues that might arise. From what I am now being told the problems have been getting steadily worse over the last 2 or 3 months reaching a peak last weekend.

Given the complaints we have received the pub will remain under scrutiny and will be subject to visits. If it continues to cause problems for its neighbours then there will be the possibility of a review.

I am Police Constable 1917 STEER of the Leicestershire Constabulary currently based at Coalville Police Station.

At 22:40pm on Saturday 26th April 2014 I was on duty in full uniform when I had caused to attend the outside of The Three Crowns Public House, Market Place in Whitwick. This was in relation to a report from CAS of a very intoxicated male with mental health issues. On arrival I could see a single responder paramedic and the licensee of The Three Crowns with the male. The male was so intoxicated he was finding it hard to walk and was falling over. As I approached the male he walked in to the road whilst traffic was approaching. The licensee was attempting to speak with the male to calm him down. The male was aggressive, shouting and swearing whilst I was dealing with him. Two colleagues arrived and assisted in trying to identify the male who was taken back to his home address in a marked Police car. The licensee of The Three Crowns stated that the male had been in to his pub earlier that evening and was not in this state. He was clear about saying that he would not serve him in the state he was. He states that the male left his pub around 9pm and would have gone else where, he was only aware of the male back outside his pub as CAS turned up so he went out to offer help. The licensee also went with the male in the Police car to accompany him on the way home. At the time of attending music from the pub was not loud, there were also no door supervisors in sight.

At 1.05am on Sunday 27th April 2014 I returned to the area and The Three Crowns. I was able

to see customers come and going from the pub, I could hear some shouting and some swearing in the street.

At 1.25pm I saw two customers a male and female from The Three Crowns leave and walk along Market Place towards Leicester Road. The male was very intoxicated and was clearly having difficulty walking, the female with him was assisting him. The male at one point left the female and started pulling at tree branches on a green area. The male was really trying to cause damage to the tree which did result in him pulling a small branch off. I was concerned at the potential for further damage to occur in the local area as such I went to speak to the male. The female by this point was shouting at the male who was walking across the green and was clearly all over the place. On speaking with the male his speech was very slurred and he was hardly making sense. The female said that they had been in the Black Horse pub in Whitwick earlier that evening and then went to the Three Crowns where they continued drinking.

At 1.35pm I saw a group of 5 – 6 people leaving The Three Crowns, most of the group appeared intoxicated and some were walking in the road. I saw a male and female split up from the group and walk towards Hall Lane. The male was heavily intoxicated and the female with him was trying to get the male to go with her. The male was aggressive towards the female, he was shouting and swearing. I approached the male as I was concerned for the female's safety and advised him about his actions. He was very unsteady on his feet, he tried to walk at one point and fell over on the floor after loosing his footing. This resulted in some minor grazes to his shoulder and hands. The female stated that the male was her brother and that he had been causing a scene in the pub and was told to leave. The male was warned about his behaviour and advised that he would be arrested if this continued. The female said that her father was coming to pick her brother up as such I maintained a presence in the area until her father arrived. The female was clearly distressed at how intoxicated her brother was and was on the phone to her mother crying.

Between 1.45am and 2.20am I remained in the area of Market Place. I saw people coming and going from The Three Crowns public house, in the main people leaving were talking loudly, there was some shouting and swearing. Some people left in taxi's and others walked through Whitwick which would be likely to cause a disturbance to local residences due to their general behaviour. At 1.55hrs I saw the final customer enter the pub however there were

customers walking in and out of the pub right up to the point of closing which was at 2.12am. There were a group that remained outside the pub until 2.20am. After this I resumed from the area.

At 6.10pm on Sunday 27th April 2014 I attended The Three Crowns Public House and requested CCTV from the licensee Nicholas Garbett. I asked for footage between 9.30pm – 10.30pm to cover the time of the incident the previous day were CAS were called to attend to the very intoxicated male with mental health issues. I also asked for footage between 1.30am – 2.30am to cover the closing of the premises. The licensee agreed to burn this footage on to disc whilst I waited with the witness Police Constable 4259 CUBISON. After about 15 minutes the licensee re-appears and states that he has been unable to work the CCTV system to do this. I asked to view the footage and asked for him to arrange for the footage to be burned on to disc at a later date. The licensee also explained that the CCTV was 12 minutes fast to the actual time. Given that it was hard to see the time on the footage played back I only viewed the footage around closing time. The time of the CCTV appears to be after 2am and I would see the footage shows 6 – 8 people still in the bar. There was one male that was sitting and still drinking from a glass. The time that the last customers leave the pub appears to show at 2.18am but again it was hard to see the time clearly. I asked the licensee why the male in the footage was still drinking and that the time appeared to be after 2am, he explained that he would not have been served the drink and would of already had it before closing. He went on to state that it is difficult to get customers to leave at the end of the night. The licensee also spoke about the incident the previous day were CAS were called to attend to the very intoxicated male with mental health issues. He stated that the male in question was quite drunk whilst at The Three Crowns. He states that the male had gone out to the back of the pub and urinated up a bin and that a customer had complained. He states that the male was ejected and that he returned around d 40 minutes later and was in an even worse state. He said that the male had in actual fact walked back in to the pub followed by the paramedic. He assisted in getting the male back outside and shortly after he states the Police attend. I asked to check the live recording time for today, this showed the time of 6.39pm and the actual time was 6.27pm. The licensee suggested that he could amend the time but then changed his mind and said that he would have to get some one in to do it. *M. Steer*

I am Police Constable 4259 CUBISON currently employed by Leicestershire Police based at Coalville Police Station. On Sunday 27th April 2014 I was on duty in full uniform and in company with PC 1917 STEER.

At around 18:10hours the same day I entered the Three Crowns Public House in Whitwick with PC STEER. We spoke to the licensee, Nicholas GARBETT in relation to CCTV for an incident which happened on Saturday 26th April 2014 and also to ascertain the closing time of the pub on Sunday 27th April 2014.

GARBETT was asked for CCTV for Saturday 26th April 2014 from 21:30hours – 22:30hours and for Sunday 27th April 2014 from 01:30hours – 02:30hours. GARBETT went upstairs and we waited downstairs near to the toilet area. We were waiting for approximately 10 minutes when GARBETT asked if we wanted to come upstairs as it wasn't working.

We went upstairs to the office area of the pub and were shown CCTV on a small monitor. GARBETT stated that the CCTV was 12 minutes out. We viewed CCTV of one of the cameras inside the pub, the CCTV was timed at 01:30 on Sunday 27th April 2014. GARBETT skipped through the CCTV towards 02:00 hours for that same day. Between 02:10- 02:19 on the CCTV I could see on the screen that there were at least six people still in the pub. These were the DJ, as pointed out by GARBETT, a female with long dark hair talking to the DJ, a male in a white shirt still drinking his drink at the bar, a female with the man still drinking his drink. Also a female walking through the pub holding helium balloons and a bridal vale, also with her was a male dressed in dark clothing.

When PC STEER pointed the male still drinking at the bar out to GARBETT he said words similar to "WE WEREN'T SERVING THEN, IT WAS THE DRINK HE ALREADY HAD". When we were viewing the CCTV and looking at the times on the screen GARBETT made comments similar to "ITS HARD WHEN IT'S JUST YOU, THE BAR STAFF, EVEN THE GLASS COLLECTERS ON TO GET EVERYONE OUT. WE HAD NO TROUBLE ON FRIDAY NIGHT WHEN IT WAS DARTS NIGHT AS WE HAD BOUNCERS ON. THEY ARE BIG AND THEY JUST GET EVERYONE OUT." When we were watching the customers on the CCTV make their way out he also said words similar to "WE CLEAR ONE AREA AND EVERYONE MOVES THROUGH TO THE NEXT AREA THAT WAY WE CAN GET PEOPLE OUT." He also spoke about the incident on Saturday 26th April 2014 involving a drunk male. GARBETT stated that he had been in the pub but had been 'thrown out' of fire exit as a customer had seen him urinating up a bin. He stated around 40 minutes later the same male came back into the pub but was being chased by paramedics and this time appeared even more drunk. GARBETT said he thinks he had been drinking elsewhere in between.

As we viewed the CCTV there was a menu bar across the screen so could not see the timing exactly but was clear enough to see the time. GARBETT stated he was not able to burn the CCTV for some reason but it would be ready for tomorrow 28/04/2014 and he opened at 12:00 so it could be collected from anytime then. PC STEER told him he would need to get the setting corrected in relation to the time if it was 12 minutes out and he said he would be able to do that as we were there. GARBETT put the menu on to do it then said he wasn't sure but had a mate who is really good with the CCTV and helped him last time he needed to burn it so would ask his mate to



This investigation is in relation to a public order offence that occurred on 23rd February 2014 at about 02:45hrs at the location of Market Place, Ashby De La Zouch, Leicester. This was around the time the pubs and nightclubs closed

At the above time uniformed police officers namely PC 2854 Garside and PC 1349 Smith along with SPC 5615 Carroll were on foot patrol in the area of the Market Place to prevent public order incidents when they observed a group of people chanting and shouting football related songs in the street. Their attention was drawn to two males in particular one of which was the defendant [REDACTED]. The officers observed the defendant and the co-accused square up to each other with a verbal altercation taking place. Officers approached the males and separated them to avoid further issues noting that the defendant seemed angry with another male trying to calm the defendant down saying "Calm down" and "It's not worth it" The co-accused was taken away by his friends to get a taxi.

The defendant was later observed by officers walk in the direction of the taxi area and the co-accused changing his course several times to head for the co-accused. The defendant was followed after officers fearing a further altercation between the males. A further verbal altercation took place between the males with the Co-accused walking up to the defendant and assaulting him by punching him in the face. The defendant also tried to punch the Co-accused.

At this time both males were arrested on suspicion of Affray and transported to Keyham Lane police station.

Investigating Officers Report

At 02.45 hrs on Sunday 23/02/14 several large groups of persons form in the street following the closure of the nearby Ciro's nightclub. One of these consists of around males who begin chanting / shouting / swearing football related slogans.

At one point the two suspects [REDACTED] and Garbett square up to each other arguing and are separated by uniformed officers and rejoin their friends. For a short period of time the two groups stare and intimidate each other. A taxi arrives and as Garbett starts to get into the rear nearside passenger seat [REDACTED] walks down the road towards the vehicle. Body language would suggest [REDACTED] shouted something at Garbett who responds by walking over to [REDACTED] and punching him in the face causing his glasses to fall off. As he falls into 2854 and 5615 he is detained as he attempts to throw a punch back. Garbett is detained by 1349

Both males are arrested for affray and conveyed to CK where they are bedded down due to being drunk.

For info Garbett is the Licencee of The 3 Crowns Public House, Market Place, Whitwick, Coalville. During the course of the evening several unconnected incidents of disorder take place within his pub.

I am Police Constable 1349 of the Leicestershire Constabulary and currently based at Coalville Police Station.

At around 02.45 hrs on Sunday 23/02/14 I was on duty in full uniform in company on foot patrol on Market Street, Ashby de la Zouch, Leics. At this time the weather was fine and it was dark. However the area was very well illuminated by overhead street lights. Due to the nearby nightclub Ciro's closing at 02.30 hrs the street was busy with numerous groups of people in the vicinity.

One of these consisted of around 25 people who were shouting and chanting football related sayings. One of these persons was a male who I now know to be [REDACTED] who stood out from the crowd due to his physical appearance and clothing. I would describe him as a white skinned male, around 5'8" and slim build. He had brown hair which was tied back in a pony tail. He was clean shaven and was wearing glasses. He was also wearing dark coloured jogging bottoms with red stripes down each side, a dark green coat which was undone. Below this he wore a red hooded top.

At one point I observed him squaring up to another male who I now know to be Nicholas William Garbett [REDACTED] as they were stood near to the Lamb Inn public house. Garbett was wearing a pale green short sleeved shirt and dark coloured jeans. At this time they were only stood around 25 feet from me but due to the noise in the street I could not hear what was being said. I then observed other uniform officers approach the two males and separate them. Watson then walked back towards me and began speaking to a few males who were part of the aforementioned group of football fans. From my position I observed the officers who were speaking to Garbett walk away from him and he then joined another group of males further down the road.

I remained close to [REDACTED] and listened to an unknown male telling him to 'calm down' and 'Its not worth it'. I continued to watch both groups who appeared to be staring and making gestures at each other. A short while later I observed a taxi pull up near to where Garbett and his group were standing. Garbett opened the rear nearside passenger door which was the closest to the footpath and stood next to it whilst speaking to a nearby male.

I then saw the back of [REDACTED] body as he walked down the footpath slightly before bearing to his right and walk towards the centre of the road. Whilst doing so he turned his head to the left and I observed him stiffen his arms at the side of his body then turn to his left and take a few paces towards the taxi. I quickly glanced at Garbett and saw that he was leaning down as if to get into the taxi. However he then stood up and looked toward [REDACTED] and appeared to shout something at him. As this was happening PC 2854 Garside and SPC 5615 Carroll were quickly walking


towards [REDACTED] who had stopped near to the rear nearside of the taxi. On seeing Garbett starting to move towards [REDACTED] I jogged over towards them. As I did so I saw Garbett swing a punch which hit [REDACTED] in the face causing his glasses to fall off. Watson fell backwards slightly into the other two uniformed officers who detained him as he attempted to throw a punch back. As this happened I was less than 15 feet away and nothing obscured my view of them. Within a few seconds I managed to take hold of Garbett and pushed him away from [REDACTED] and back towards the footpath.

I then said to him "I am arresting you on suspicion of Affray CAUTION" whilst I handcuffed his hands to the rear of his body with the assistance of another uniformed officer. I then escorted him to a marked Police van which had just pulled up alongside and placed him inside the rear secure compartment. I then assisted PC Garside with handcuffing [REDACTED] and he was subsequently placed inside the mid section of the van.

A short while later I spoke with Garbett and informed him again of the reason for his arrest and that this was necessary to allow for a prompt and effective investigation to take place and to prevent him from participating in any other disorder with other members of the public

Both males were then conveyed to the custody Suite at Keyham lane Police Station where their detention was authorised.

I am Special Police Constable 5615 of Leicestershire Police currently based at Coalville Police Station.

At approximately 0245hrs on Sunday 23rd February 2014 I was on duty in full uniform in call sign MV05. I was crewed alongside PC 2854 GARSIDE, PC 900 DUDLEY, PC 1536 JACKSON and PC 1349 SMITH. We were on foot patrol on MARKET STREET, ASHBY where I could hear a large group of approximately 25 males chanting football chants loudly in the street, close to the ASHBY GRILL. I then observed an argument between a group of four of the males, they were all told to disperse and to go home. They were separated and two of the males walked down MARKET STREET to get a taxi, this was at the area in front of THE LAMB public house. The other two remained on MARKET STREET close to the ASHBY GRILL.

One of these males was later identified as [REDACTED] I would describe him as a white male, approximately 5'11" and slim build. He had brown hair, past shoulder length, that was tied back into a ponytail. He was clean shaven and was wearing glasses. He was wearing a green coat, with a red hooded jacket underneath. He had black jogging bottoms on with a red stripe down the side and was wearing trainers.

Approximately 10 minutes later at around 0250hrs, I witnessed [REDACTED] walk past me and down MARKET STREET in the direction of the taxi and the other males. He stood in the road

behind the taxi and words were exchanged between the two males. I could not hear what was said. A male getting into the taxi, who was later identified as Nicholas GARBETT

██████████ I describe him as wearing blue trainers with a white NIKE tick on the side, black skinny style jeans and a green shirt sleeved top. He has a tattoo sleeve down his right arm.

GARBETT stopped getting into the taxi and began to move towards ██████████ who had stopped behind the rear of the taxi. I began to move closer to the two males alongside PC 2854. I saw GARBETT get very close to ██████████ and make a motion with his head as if to head butt ██████████ but he did not connect with him. He then swung his right arm round and punched ██████████ on the left side of his chin. ██████████ then fell backwards from the impact of the punch, causing his glasses to fall off. Myself, PC 1349 and PC 2854 were moving towards the two males as this was happening and PC 2854 took a hold of ██████████ as he fell. I was following PC 2854 toward the males and carried on past ██████████ to join PC 1349 taking hold of GARBETT.

We moved GARBETT away from ██████████ in the escort position and out of the road to the bus stop shelter by the side of the road. At approximately 0255hrs, PC 1349 arrested GARBETT for Affray and cautioned him. I do not recall his reply after caution. He was placed in handcuffs to the rear and taken to the back of the police van, which was driven down to us by PC 1536, and placed inside.

I then assisted PC 2854 in putting ██████████ inside the middle of the van after he was also arrested for affray. At this time he was also handcuffed to the rear.

We then conveyed them both to KEYHAM LANE custody, where their detention was authorised.

The amount of time that I observed ██████████ and GARBETT was for approximately five minutes, this is from when I witnessed ██████████ moving down MARKET STREET towards the taxi and GARBETT.

██████████ was approximately 45-50 metres away from GARBETT before he walked down towards him. He was 5 metres from me when he began to walk down the street and when they were both arguing they were approximately 15 metres from me. The visibility of MARKET STREET was illuminated by adequate street lighting. There were other people along the

I am Police Constable 2854 of the Leicestershire Constabulary, currently based at Coalville Police Station.

On Sunday 23rd February 2014 I was on duty and in full uniform in call sign MV05 conducting Public Order patrols on Market Street, Ashby de la ZOUCH. It was dark but Market Street was lit with street lighting. It was cold but dry with good visibility.

At about 0230 hrs after the Ciro's night club had closed there were a large number of groups of revellers still on the street. A group of approximately 20-25 were stood close to The Lamb pub singing football songs; they appeared to be Leicester and Derby County fans. I was out on foot keeping observations on the group and other people around the area. I suddenly became aware of a male in a green polo neck T Shirt who had become involved in an altercation with another group. I quickly isolated the male and pulled him away from the scene. He gave me his name as a Nicholas GARBETT. He soon calmed down, other Officers had spoken to other individuals involved but there were no complaints. GARBETT stated that another male was goading him about coming from Measham. He was advised and taken away from the scene to get a taxi by his friends. After speaking with GARBETT I noted colleagues had spoken to another male who I would describe as being tall and skinny, white with long straight dark hair worn back in a pony tail. He was wearing a dark brown jacket with a red soft material jacket underneath and dark tracksuit bottoms. He also wore glasses. I now know this male to be [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] He was with a group chanting the football songs. Despite being spoken to by Officers [REDACTED] seemed unhappy about and angry about his altercation with GARBETT.

A short time later I saw GARBETT approximately 30 feet further down the street. He was still with his friends. At about 0245 hours I became aware of a group of males shouting at [REDACTED] and the [REDACTED] was quickly walking down the road, on the road. Looking and listening I formed the opinion that the shouts were trying to stop [REDACTED] from his intended actions. I recall seeing GARBETT and looked to see GARBETT and his friends surrounding a dark blue Peugeot taxi. Fearing a possible further altercation between the two I made by way toward the taxi [REDACTED] had walked down the road itself toward GARBETT who looked to be getting in to the taxi. I stepped on to the road and was at this point directly behind [REDACTED] and following him, I was approximately 2 metres behind when I saw that GAREBTT was no longer getting in to the taxi but had turned to square up to [REDACTED] who was still walking straight towards him. I could not see the front of [REDACTED] at this time and my view of GARBETT was partially blocked by [REDACTED]. However I heard both exchange verbal comments and then saw GARBETT lunge forward at [REDACTED]. I thought that GARBETT had head butted [REDACTED] because as a result of this lunge [REDACTED] fell backwards and by this time I was much closer to him and was able to catch him as he fell toward the ground. His glasses had come off. At this time I was joined by SPC 5615 CARROLL. Despite comments made by [REDACTED] he was just walking home when he was attacked, he could have taken any other route down the street to avoid GARBETT. I also knew that [REDACTED] had been involved in the earlier altercation. Looking over I saw that GARBETT had been detained by PC 1349 SMITH.

At 0255 hours I told [REDACTED] that he was under arrest on suspicion of affray. He was cautioned and told that his arrest was necessary for a prompt and effective investigation and to prevent further injury being caused to either him or others. He was handcuffed in the rear back to back position by myself and PC SMITH who had by this time joined me. This was in order to prevent escape and prevent further assaults. He was placed in to the seated part of the van and conveyed to Keyham Lane Custody Suite where his detention was subsequently authorised. Half way through the journey I replaced the rear back to back position with a front stack position for comfort.

On attendance there are several people in Market Place Whitwick, one male does not have a shirt on and has blood on his face, this was the victim [REDACTED]. He was with a female, details were taken, but she did not see the offence, and only saw a group of males after the incident, she could not say what had happened.

The Victim, [REDACTED] was heavily in drink, he had a cut to his lip top of head and arm. He initially said nothing had happened. Then he said he had been set upon by travellers in the pub, and then said he had stuck up for a male outside the pub who had been hit and had his glasses knocked off. He had then been set upon by the same people.

He initially did not think anyone that was responsible was still at the location, but then pointed out a male, who was detained and arrested by Pc Allsop.

He provided his details as [REDACTED]

However once he was in the rear of the car he stated that he had been assaulted by [REDACTED] and had his glasses knocked off. Once [REDACTED] had punched him to the ground, two other males (possibly friends of [REDACTED] though he would not comment), came and attacked [REDACTED] to get him off him. [REDACTED] had a small amount of dried blood on his top lip.

A female then approached the police who initially had said she did not see anything, and admitted to be the caller to inc 78 [REDACTED] she stated that the male that had been arrested was actually attacked by the male covered in blood [REDACTED] and had not assaulted anyone. She refused further details, but did say that there were others involved, but she did not know who.




I am Police Constable 2925 James BROOMFIELD of Leicestershire Police, currently based at Coalville Police Station.

On the evening of Friday 22nd November 2013 myself and PC 819 Harrison undertook a number of licensed premises visits across North West Leicestershire. This included a visit to The Three Crown public house, Whitwick. At this time we spoke to a Mr Nicholas Garbett who was working behind the bar area, he stated that he was the licensee for the premises. The pub was not particularly busy and Mr Garbett was happy to engage in conversation. At 0125hrs Sunday 24th November 2013 myself and PC 819 Harrison were static on the junction of Hall Lane and Leicester Road, Whitwick where we were in plain clothes in an unmarked vehicle. At 0130hrs we saw that the front doors of The Three Crowns were open and musical lights were shimmering, there were a large number of people still inside the pub. There was a steady flow of people leaving the pub, standing outside smoking and talking. I also witnessed a couple of people leave the pub, go to the nearby taxi rank and then go back inside the pub. At 0200hrs the front doors were still open, musical lights were still on and most people had now left the pub. At 0205hrs I saw six persons stood outside the pub, speaking in raised voices and gesturing aggressively towards each other. A male then came outside the pub shouted loudly at the group and slammed the front door shut. The males then started pushing and shoving each other. The group dispersed almost immediately when a marked police vehicle drove past. At 0230hrs a group of people leave the pub, the front door is closed and external and internal lights are turned off. The group walked off along Hall Lane and were clearly extremely intoxicated based on the fact that they were uneasy on their feet and staggering from side to side.

Between 0130hrs-0200hrs Saturday 3rd February 2014 I conducted regular patrols along Marker Street, Silver Street, Whitwick. There were no issues and all was in order.

At 1730hrs Thursday 27th February 2014 I visited The Three Crowns in order to speak with Mr GARBETT to retrieve CCTV for a crime investigation. Mr GARBETT was not at the premises and I left my business card for him to contact me. The clientele in the pub were friendly and jovial.





Icons are described in numerical order from top left to bottom right.

Therefore ICON 4, is on top row fourth one along and so on.

Icon 4. Key time (KT)= 01:57:44 Location pool room.

Perp moves from pool room to attack a male in next room.

Icon10 KT =01:57:47 Location Bar

Start of fight in background as perp attacks male, fighting in background seen. Door bar staff watch and do nothing. They do not call male colleagues. They do not call help. Simply watch and continue to bottle up, though clearly one lady backs away as automatic reaction.

Icon 19 KT=01:40 to 01:42 Location outside front door

This shows an initial confrontation outside front door to premises between shorter male in black gillet jacket and a male in grey. Male in Gillet is joined by taller, larger male in dark clothing. This male takes shirt off and attempts to start a fight. All three then go into premises.

(Male in Gillett and taller male are responsible for fight inside premises at 01:57:47 and subsequent scuffles later)

Icon 19 KT=01:59.39 Location outside front door

This shows an initial argument between a couple

This then shows a male falling onto floor from direction of door. This male gets up and throws a punch towards person by door and scuffle ensues.

Further scuffles break out between various people immediately outside and directly from premises.

Subject: The Three Crowns Hotel, 25 Market Place Whitwick LE67 5DT

I write following an interview I had with you under caution on 30/11/2013 at Coalville Police station. Details of the incidents discussed appear below. A copy of this letter has also been sent to Enterprise Taverns and Mr Sam Wallace who is shown as the current premises license holder for this establishment.

During interview the following matters were discussed:

1. **Saturday 16th November 2013 – “Lock In” and subsequent violent assault.**

The premises did not shut until 3.10am after police had been called to deal with a fight outside. At this time numbers of people were found inside the premises drinking despite the fact the license conditions state the sale of alcohol must cease at 1.30am and the premises must close at 2am. You admitted to giving 'free drinks' away that evening and that people were still drinking at 3.10am.

The assault was serious and all persons involved were drunk and had come from your premise. One person named as receiving free drinks was directly involved in the fight and had been involved in altercations inside the hotel prior to the assault outside.

At the time you were reluctant to allow CCTV to be viewed and it was not until a senior police officer present challenged you that you allowed the officer to view the footage. During interview you claimed that CCTV recording equipment was in a room where your partner was sleeping and you didn't wish to wake her. The CCTV could not be downloaded or burnt to disc because you did not know *and* could not operate the system. Additionally it was found that only 3 of the current 9 cameras were in working order.

Despite this fact and while Police were in attendance a person arrived at the pub and attempted to gain entry into the premises. You claim this individual was an employee. Nevertheless at 3.10am the pub should have been closed.

The above represent offences under S136 of the licensing Act

2. **Friday 22nd November 2013 - Licence visit.**

On this date you were not the holder of a personal license (PL) and as such all sales of alcohol should have been authorised. You could not produce any authorisation list / and no premises licence was available for inspection when requested. You claim Sam Wallace (DPS) had authorised sales but he was not present and you claim difficulty in getting the premises licence. Since this license visit you claim to have an authorisation list prepared.

This amounts to an offence under S136 of the licensing Act.

3. Saturday 23rd November 2013 – Breach of licensing conditions

During normal police patrols officers witnessed the pub remain open after closing hours. At 2am when you should have closed completely persons were seen entering and leaving the hotel while others were seen leaving at 2:30am. The license conditions for these premises dictate the premise must close at 2am.

Performance of dance or music should cease at 1.30am according to the license on Saturdays yet at 2am police officers observed disco lights flashing in the premises suggesting entertainment was continuing.

A skirmish / scuffle was observed outside the pub involving drunken males who had come from the premises. This matter was witnessed by officers. The response you gave during interview was that you have a dispersal policy but preferred to allow people leave gradually.

You accept the premises doors remained open past closing hours and that regulars do leave at 2:30. You claim this was part of your own dispersal policy adding you believe this necessary to reduce noise and to prevent persons leaving when drunk. You specifically refer to two individuals witnessed leaving at 2.30am as a 'couple of regulars' inferring this was acceptable.

The above represent offences under S136 of the licensing Act.

We are currently investigating a further assault that occurred during the early hours of Saturday 30th November 2013 at the Hotel. A suspect was arrested for assaulting a number of people who had left the premises drunk. This person came from the licensed premise and went to an alternative address where they subsequently assaulted x4 others at that location. The suspect was so intoxicated at the time of arrest and could not be interviewed until the following day. This person had been drinking at your pub most of the evening and had left extremely intoxicated.

This represents an offence under S136 of the licensing Act.

I am disappointed that Mr Wallice failed to attend Coaville Police station on the 30th November for interview as the DPS. His lack of attendance suggests he fails to fully appreciate the seriousness of the issues discussed and this is not in keeping with maintaining and upholding the licensing objectives.

I am led to believe you are due to become the DPS for the Three Crowns and as such I expect you to be fully aware of the licence objectives.

At the end of your interview you asked what the Police could do to support you running the pub and discussion took place regarding an action plan. I have now received an action plan from you and would agree with its content as an interim measure. I have highlighted some salient points from an email you sent to me (appendix 'A').

Police options were discussed following your interview and I asked you to put measures into place that would address concerns we have linked to The Three Crowns Hotel. Your action plan does address some of the issues we spoke about and I thank you for this.

However in the interests of proportionality the following will be undertaken:

The action plan will be monitored for a period of 6 months.

I would also urge you to consider a voluntary licence variation to include the following:

- a) CCTV should be working correctly involving all cameras.
- b) All CCTV footage should be available for a period of 28 days.
- c) CCTV should be made available to Police or a Licensing Officer upon request.
- d) It should be in a format that is useable and available immediately or in a reasonable time period.
- e) SIA Door staff should be employed as outlined in your action plan.
- f) Your licensing hours should reflect those in your action plan.

You discussed a proposal to reduce your trading hrs by 30minutes. Regardless of this period (weekdays or weekends) it will require a variation of your license to be submitted to the counsel. This can be undertaken at the time you submit the other variations we discussed.

Please consider this letter as a formal warning against you and to the future conduct of the running of the Three Crowns Hotel.

Should there be any further breaches of licence conditions linked to crime and disorder, nuisance, or public safety within the next 6 months this will lead to a full review of the licence and potentially significant consequences for you as the new DPS.

In addition I withhold the right to review the licence depending on your responses in relation to the matters above.

My home is situated in very close proximity to the Three Crowns Public House which is located on Market Place, Whitwick.

I don't recall the exact date but around eighteen months ago the anti social behaviour of persons visiting and using the premises became a progressively major problem and of real concern to local residents attempting to live normal lives and in peace.

I am sure that the worsening situation coincided with the appointment of the current manager. The previous manager/landlord was a man named 'Sam'.

The current manager seems to have attracted a very different clientele most of whom seem to visit the premises from outside of the local community.

In general terms the anti social behaviour that other local residents and I have been forced to put up with includes shouting, screaming, fighting, arguments, foul and obscene language, disorder from the premises and out in the street together with loud music emanating from the premises which at times can be heard reverberating around the inside of my home. My son often sleeps with his bedroom windows tight shut but despite this he is awoken on a regular basis by noise emanating from the Three Crowns.





I am Police Sergeant 531 Mark Watson, of the Leicestershire constabulary; based at Coalville Police station. This statement will outline contacts that I have recently had with Mr Garbett, the now DPS at Three Crowns public house, Whitwick.

On Sunday 24th November 2013 I attended the Three Crowns Public house. (application says 22nd Nov=,error). He was unable to burn cctv footage for an incident at his premises which occurred 16th November.

We discussed the possible breaches of his license on 16th November. He said " yeah I had a lock in, I admit it." "you'll see the tray was open, no money changed hands". I advised Mr Garbett that I wasn't interviewing there and then. He explained that he gradually released people as he no longer had door staff.

He didn't know how to use the CCTV equipment and couldn't burn evidence off.

I explained my concerns and that I expected a tighter ship over coming weeks.

We agreed to meet 30th November for an Interview.


On the 30th November 2013 I saw Mr Garbett at Coalville police station and interviewed him in relation to allegations of breaches of his license on 16th and 24th November.

Later same day, 30th November an e mail was received from Mr Garbett, outlining an action plan drawn up by him, on our recommendation. This was to address the issues raised.

Mr Garbett was not prosecuted as a result of this interview. He made various admissions, which are listed in a warning letter given to him 4th December at a Pub Watch meeting.

I felt this was a proportionate response to the incidents and enabled Mr Garbett to show that he could support the licence objectives.

You will note the content of the warning letter. This was designed to encourage Mr Garbett to implement a 6 month action plan and consider a voluntary variation of his conditions, to support the license objectives. This is a key element of the tiered approach we adopt. I had options to both prosecute and consider review in order to obtain stronger conditions. But I opted for this approach in order to encourage positive change.

Signs over Christmas were initially encouraging. A test purchase operation was carried out 7th December and no sale of alcohol, was made to an under age person.

I continued to attempt to work with Mr Garbett and over the 18th/19th December and agreed to amended TENS, submitted by Mr Garbett; for the Christmas period. I was pleased to note no serious incidents of violence over Christmas. I consider that limited hours and extra door staff, combined with extra support by police, contributed to a reduction in violent crime in Whitwick centre, generally over this period.

However I quickly observed that what I expected to be a 6 month action plan submitted by Mr Garbett was not being continued in the New Year.


The incidents mentioned within the bundle came to a head, when I saw Mr Garbett 2nd March. I had noted that CCTV had not been produced, despite numerous requests from PC Broomfield, concerning an incident on 23rd February. I saw Mr Garbett, who produced the CCTV.

At this meeting I made it clear that I was now reviewing all incidents and considering my options, including a review application. We discussed Mr Garbetts options to show how he could support the license objectives. I explained that he could consider a voluntary variation of his license, based on the temporary action plan at Christmas. It was explained what support was available to him at the licensing dpt at council aswell as from me.

I received no follow up requests for help or advice.

Since that meeting further incidents have occurred, per the bundle. On the 17th April I saw Mr Garbett at coalville Police station. This meeting was arranged at his request, following a telephone call 16th April. At this meeting I listened to proposals made by Mr Garbett. He made

Despite all of the incidents and issues for residents I was prepared to listen and engage with Mr Garbett. I even made some suggestions. I made it clear that I would consider anything he put forward positively. The meeting ended with an agreement that Mr Garbett would forward a report; with his ideas ahead of a voluntary variation if those ideas were agreed. This was to be completed by 19th April.

I then received a voice mail from Mr Garbett to say that he would infact not be submitting a report and that Mr Wallace wished to contest the review process.

I spoke with Mr Garbett on 23rd April. He reiterated that Mr Wallace wished to contest the review. Following the conversation I reassured Mr Garbett that I am prepared to listen to any future representations from him. I explained the review process continues.

In conclusion, I consider that I have attempted to work with Mr Garbett positively over the last year. I do not believe he has been supporting the license objectives, but despite this I have continued to attempt to adhere to a tiered approach. I have not resorted to prosecution when it was open to me. Instead I have suggested various ways of enabling Mr Garbett to change his business practices, to support the license conditions.

Mr Garbett only finally came to see me with positive ideas, once the review process started. He then immediately back tracked.

I consider that REVIEW is the only option available to me.


I am Police Constable 2925 James BROOMFIELD of Leicestershire Police, currently based at Coalville Police Station.

On the evening of Friday 22nd November 2013 myself and PC 819 Harrison undertook a number of licensed premises visits across North West Leicestershire. This included a visit to The Three Crown public house, Whitwick. At this time we spoke to a Mr Nicholas Garbett who was working behind the bar area, he stated that he was the licensee for the premises. The pub was not particularly busy and Mr Garbett was happy to engage in conversation. At 0125hrs Sunday 24th November 2013 myself and PC 819 Harrison were static on the junction of Hall Lane and Leicester Road, Whitwick where we were in plain clothes in an unmarked vehicle. At 0130hrs we saw that the front doors of The Three Crowns were open and musical lights were shimmering, there were a large number of people still inside the pub. There was a steady flow of people leaving the pub, standing outside smoking and talking. I also witnessed a couple of people leave the pub, go to the nearby taxi rank and then go back inside the pub. At 0200hrs the front doors were still open, musical lights were still on and most people had now left the pub. At 0205hrs I saw six persons stood outside the pub, speaking in raised voices and gesturing aggressively towards each other. A male then came outside the pub shouted loudly at the group and slammed the front door shut. The males then started pushing and shoving each other. The group dispersed almost immediately when a marked police vehicle drove past. At 0230hrs a group of people leave the pub, the front door is closed and external and internal lights are turned off. The group walked off along Hall Lane and were clearly extremely intoxicated based on the fact that they were uneasy on their feet and staggering from side to side.

Between 0130hrs-0200hrs Saturday 3rd February 2014 I conducted regular patrols along Marker Street, Silver Street, Whitwick. There were no issues and all was in order.

At 1730hrs Thursday 27th February 2014 I visited The Three Crowns in order to speak with Mr GARBETT to retrieve CCTV for a crime investigation. Mr GARBETT was not at the premises and I left my business card for him to contact me. The clientele in the pub were friendly and jovial.





On the evening of Friday 22nd November 2013 myself and PC 2925 Broomfield undertook a number of licensed premises visits across Coalville area . This included a visit to The Three Crown public house, Whitwick. At this time we spoke to a Mr Nicholas Garbett who was working behind the bar area, he stated that he was the licensee for the premises. The pub was not particularly busy and Mr Garbett was happy to engage in conversation.

At 0125hrs Sunday 24th November 2013 myself and PC Broomfield were static on the junction of Hall Lane and Leicester Road, Whitwick where we were in plain clothes in an unmarked vehicle. At 0130hrs we saw that the front doors of The Three Crowns were open and musical lights were shimmering, there were a large number of people still inside the pub. There was a steady flow of people leaving the pub, standing outside smoking and talking. I also witnessed a couple of people leave the pub, go to the nearby taxi rank and then go back inside the pub. At 0200hrs the front doors were still open, musical lights were still on and most people had now left the pub. At 0205hrs I saw six persons stood outside the pub, speaking in raised voices and gesturing aggressively towards each other. A male then came outside the pub shouted loudly at the group and slammed the front door shut. The males then started pushing and shoving each other. The group dispersed almost immediately when a marked police vehicle drove past. At 0230hrs a group of people leave the pub, the front door is closed and external and internal lights are turned off. The group walked off along Hall Lane and were clearly extremely intoxicated based on the fact that they were uneasy on their feet and staggering from side to side.


I am Police Constable 3026 Crane of the Leicestershire Constabulary, currently based at Coalville Police Station. On Saturday 16th November 2013 I was on full uniformed duty. At around 0320 hrs I attended Market Place, Whitwick outside the Three Crowns Public House following a report of a disturbance occurring in the street.

Upon arrival I could see an ambulance at the location and a male being seen to by a first responder. This male identified himself to be [REDACTED] and stated that he had been punched in the nose by another male. I could see that there was a lot of blood on his clothes which appeared to have come from his nose which was still bleeding. Mr [REDACTED] appeared highly intoxicated as his speech was slurred and he could not seem to stick to a single version of events or say who had done this to him. Whilst speaking with Mr [REDACTED] I became aware that there were another two males sat in the rear of the ambulance being seen to by another paramedic.

Whilst officers were speaking with the parties involved I could see a number of people milling around the front door of the Three Crowns, I thought this was strange as the pub is usually closed by then. PS 758 Gosling requested that PC 325 Gilkes and I attend the Three Crowns to enquire about any witnesses to the assault as [REDACTED] stated that this is where the incident had started. As we walked towards the front entrance of the pub I looked through the window and could see that the lights inside were dimmed but there were still a number of people inside. PC Gilkes knocked on the door and after a short time an unknown male came to the door and stated "I've been asked to let you in". Inside the pub I was greeted by a male who introduced himself as Nick Garbett who stated that he was the landlord of the pub. When he was asked about the people still inside the location he stated that they were his "non paying guests". I believe there were around 7 people in total within the pub, 4 sat around the bar and another 3 sat at a table near the exit to a yard area.

PC Gilkes asked Mr Garbett if we could speak privately and he took us out into the yard area. When asked about the trouble that had occurred outside he stated that Mr [REDACTED] had been in the pub earlier.






I am Police Sergeant 758 Shaun Gosling of the Leicestershire Police. I am currently based at Coalville Police Station. On Saturday 16th November 2013 I was on uniform patrol. Around 03:20hrs I attended Market Place Whitwick, outside the Three Crowns Public House (PH). This was in response to a radio communication of a fight at the location. On arrival there were two people with injuries. Officers were dealing with these individuals. I tasked Pc 325 Gilkes and Pc 3026 Crane to speak with people inside the Three Crowns PH. This was to ascertain if there were any witnesses or CCTV at the location that would aid the investigation of the assault. I was supervising the officers outside when Pc Gilkes and Crane returned they commented that there were still a number of people in the PH, and that the landlord had told them that they were his guests and non paying. At some point I noted a male had alighted from a taxi and banged on the window of the PH which seemed quite natural as if he expected the PH to be open or people to be in it. Then I noted around seven to ten people had come out of the PH. I felt that this was extremely strange for this number of "guests" to be coming out. I needed to speak with the landlord with regard to the CCTV, as the assault was particularly serious. Myself and Pc 325 Gilkes went to the PH. We knocked the door loudly and after a short time a male that identified himself as Nicholas Garbett answered the door. I said to him that I needed to view the CCTV, he immediately became reluctant, stating that he did not know how to work it all. I asked him, if we could still come in and try and see if he could fathom it all out. Again Mr Garbett was reluctant to help, and stated that the room was a mess, that there were dogs, and then went onto say that he would need to speak with his manager. I felt that Mr Garbett was being obstructive, and only after I clearly told him that the matter was



extremely serious and that we needed to check the CCTV that he seemed to accept this and invited ourselves in. I asked what his position was, he stated that he was the landlord, I then asked if he had the License for the premises, to which he said no, and that Sam Wallace of the Lamb Inn PH was the DPS. I asked if Mr Wallace had been in attendance during the evening which he replied no. I felt his actions in regard to the CCTV was not that becoming of a responsible landlord who I would expect to assist the Police Service when incidents of this nature happen. I have then said to Mr Garbett, " You had a lot of people just to be non paying guests." Mr Garbett replied "YES THEY WERE MY GUESTS." I said. "I don't believe you, that number of people in your pub were not guests." At this point Mr Garbett has said "I HAD A SMALL LOCK IN." From that I took it to mean that the people were having after hours drinks. We have then gone to the office to review the CCTV. Mr Garbett did not seem to have any problems in accessing the CCTV and re-playing it. Whilst watching the CCTV which periodically was viewed showing the times between 0230 to 0300hrs, it was clear that there were a number of people in the PH some stood at the bar. I further said to Mr Garbett, "If you had not been serving these people this may not have happened." Mr Garbett replied "I REALISE THAT I KNOW WHAT YOU MEAN." Mr Garbett could not download the CCTV footage. Myself and Pc Gilkes then left the premises. I informed Mr Garbett that I would be taking the issue of the Lock in further.
