Shop equipment	Staff/customers could get electrical shocks or burns from using faulty electrical equipment, including portable electrical equipment – heaters, fans etc. Electrical faults can also lead to fires. Staff may also suffer injury from moving parts of equipment or unbalanced equipment.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All new equipment is checked before the first use to ensure that there are no obvious accessible dangerous moving parts, or the siting of the equipment does not cause additional hazards. Staff are encouraged to spot and report any defective plugs, discoloured sockets, damaged cable and on/off switches. 				
Cleaning	Staff risk skin irritation or eye damage from direct contact with cleaning chemicals. Vapour from cleaning chemicals may cause breathing problems.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mops, brushes and protective gloves are provided and used. Staff are shown how to use cleaning products safely. Cleaning materials are properly stored.

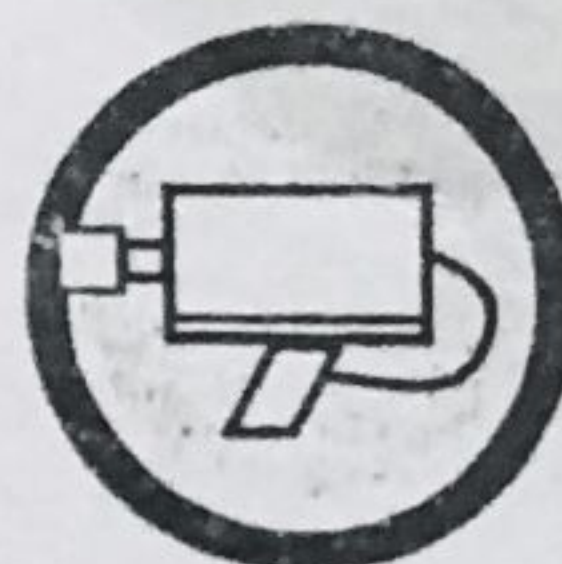
