Objection to the Application by Ashby Ivanhoe Football Club for variations to their Premises Licence

- 1. In recognising the close proximity of the club premises to local residents the current licence conditions were imposed to promote the licensing objectives and have generally worked well. The current situation is one that fairly balances the current needs of the club with those of the local residents.**

- 2. The changes that the club is applying for would totally change the existing balance between the needs of the club and the local community. Apart from potentially increasing the consumption of alcohol, both on and off site, under them the club would be able to play live music outside the premises all day from 12.00 to 23.00 as often as they liked with no limit on the number of the pre booked private functions during the year. This has the potential to severely impact on the local residents through:**
 - **Increased noise pollution not only from increased usage within the current permitted areas but also from anywhere on the grounds. For example, it would seem to permit the playing of music during matches with loudspeaker located anywhere on the site.**
 - **Increased nuisance from on street parking on the adjacent estate, which is already an increasing issue on match days.**
 - **Increased traffic flow on what is already a heavily used road, particularly at certain times of the day.**
 - **Accentuate the problems with the entrance visibility out of the ground.**
 - **The inclusion of off premises sales could lead to increased litter in the surrounding areas.**

- 3. The potential impact of the changes that the club are seeking should be assessed not only in the context of the current levels of usage but their future plans as set out on their website. Here they refer to plans " To make a Community Hub for the town" and "..create a 1500 capacity football ground with a community building and training facility...".**
