
<b>Licensing Objective</b>	<b><i>Please provide full details of your concerns regarding the application and include any evidence you may have in support of it. Please use separate sheets if necessary</i></b>
<b>To prevent crime and disorder</b>	The variation in terminal hours, the playing of live and amplified music outside and the extension of alcohol sales has the principal purpose of encouraging more, noisier and larger gatherings of people in a quiet residential area, which potentially will lead to conflict and possible disorder.
<b>Public safety</b>	Current activity on the site which has very limited car parking creates both hazardous and inconsiderate parking along Lower Packington Road and illegal parking on the grass verges opposite and adjacent to the club. The local estate roads are plagued by significant amounts of inconsiderate and double parking, particularly on match and event days. The proposed variations would massively increase these problems.
<b>To prevent public nuisance</b>	The proposed variations, particularly the sale of alcohol, the playing of live and amplified music outside, the extension of terminal hours and the removal of restrictions on the number of private pre-booked functions will create significant public nuisance to many local residents who live adjacent to the site. Further to this, the site is in a semi-rural position with abutting fields which are used for the grazing of livestock. The noise and disturbance resulting from a relaxation of current conditions will be harmful and potentially hazardous.
<b>To protect children from harm</b>	There are many families with young children living in close proximity to the site, the potential noise and disturbance from late night, alcohol fuelled music events on the site will be detrimental to the children's well being.

<b>Please suggest any conditions that could be added to the licence to remedy</b>	The additional conditions which the Applicant is now seeking to lift were originally imposed by the Sub-
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**your representation or other suggestions you would like the Licensing Sub Committee to take into account.**

Committee having particular regard to the representations made at the time. They were imposed because the Sub-Committee felt they were necessary to promote the licencing objectives. This situation has not changed. Indeed, the club has operated successfully under these circumstances for the last 8 years, suggesting that they were appropriate and well thought through.

The stated aim of the club is to create a community hub with a capacity of 1500 spectators. This is a totally unsuitable site for such a facility. The local road network, lack of parking facilities, proximity to local housing etc could not safely support such a proposal. This current application is aimed at supporting this objective and would be at the expense of the quality of life and safety of many local residents and as such it should be refused and the existing conditions re-imposed.,
