| <b>To prevent crime and disorder</b> | The additional 4 hours of alcohol sales every day of the week, could cause drunken disorder issues around the site, and on nearby roads.   |
| <b>Public safety</b>                 | There are already parking issues on some occasions with cars parked on the verges opposite the official car park and onto the local housing streets, and it is felt this will become more commonplace should extended hours and live music events take place, making it difficult to cross roads and walk the footpaths forcing persons to walk in the road. This already happens when a big match is played in the afternoons, but could become dangerous if live music gigs are permitted until late at night with cars then being there during hours of darkness too.   |
| <b>To prevent public nuisance</b>    | The removal of clauses preventing amplified music is of concern to local residents as we can already hear the fans at the club during matches from our addresses. If amplified music and live music is allowed outside the venue to late at night, ANY day of the week this would cause serious disruption to local homeowners with small children trying to get family to sleep etc. Persons leaving a venue after midnight would cause a considerable increase in noise over current levels in the area. If off premises sales were to be permitted from 10am-midnight this would increase traffic flow in the area over current levels, as the club could effectively become an off licence shop with persons drinking in the streets, thereby increasing potential litter. |

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| <p><b>Please suggest any conditions that could be added to the licence to remedy your representation or other suggestions you would like the Licensing Sub Committee to take into account.</b></p> | <p><b>An upper time limit of alcohol sales to be no later than 22:00hrs as currently and no outside amplified/live/recorded music to be played. A decibel limit to prevent disruption to nearby residents. Permit a maximum of 5 dates a year (dates decided by the club and to be published locally) which would allow for such extensions as the club request (extended alcohol hours, live music etc), to be reviewed on a rolling 12 months to see how local residents manage with the noise and disruption such events could cause.</b></p> |
