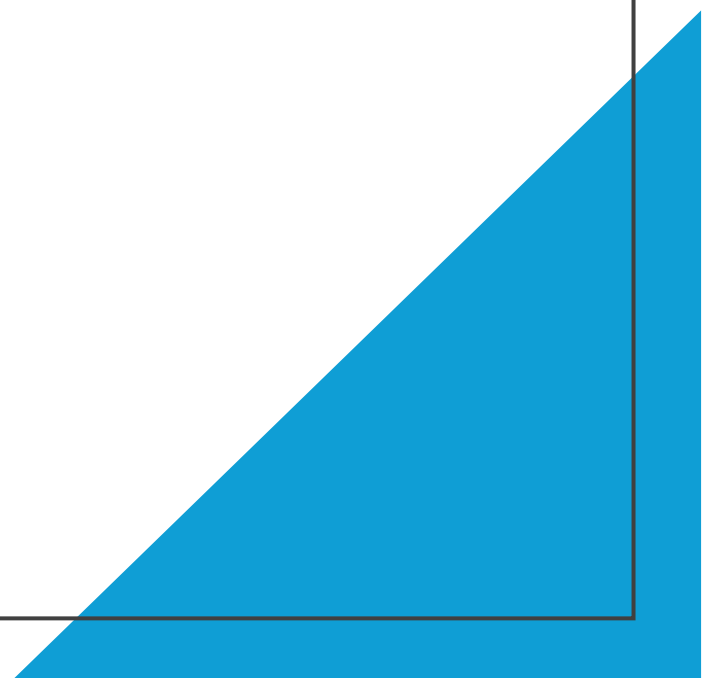

COALVILLE is gearing up for a festive extravaganza as its annual Christmas in Coalville celebration is set to return.

The event is planned for Saturday, November 23 from 10am to 5pm, and will include the return of the Living Snow Globe from 2022, which is back after popular demand.

The community event is to be held across Marlborough Square, Belvoir Shopping Centre and Needham's Walk car park, with the day's main events taking place at the newly refurbished square.

There, the main stage will host a lineup of live performances, including popular local band Whiskey Chasers, community choir groups like Singing for the Soul Choir and Coalville Christ Church Community Choir, as well as Thornley Dance Academy and Century Theatre Academy.

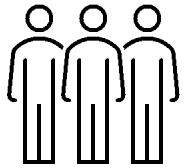

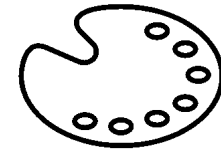
