<p>I write in my capacity as Force Licensing Manager for the Leicestershire Police on the authority delegated to me by the Chief Constable.</p> <p>I am of the opinion that granting of this application would undermine the licensing objectives of the Prevention Crime and Disorder and the Prevention of Public Nuisance. The premises are in a populated residential area, to be open throughout</p>

the entire night is

a) without president in the area and

b) would I believe cause unnecessary disruption to the sleep of local residents.

As a result of my concerns I have conducted a level of community consultation to gauge any issues related to the premises which may not have been reported to me, this has resulted in the following reports:-

1 resident reports there have been noise issues through the summer particularly on weekends.

1 resident reports problems with noise associated with the club and drunk persons fighting as they leave the premises.

1 resident reports loud music which goes on all night and shouting and swearing coming from the club.


1 resident reports noise from the club most weekends, which spills into the street and the side of the club and issues with drunk people shouting and swearing.

There is further consultation ongoing given the issues highlighted but within the time scales this is what has been gathered thus far.

In light of the fact that residents are already reporting issues with noise and drunken behaviour I believe the grant of this application would severely undermine the licensing objectives of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

Furthermore this is the same night which has previously been held at Ibstock Working Men's Club which has had issues of noise & disorder associated with this event. The change of venue for the event does not mean the event will be better run or organised.
